

"THREE WEEKS" COMING

Elinor Glyn's Play Three Weeks Causes Much Discussion Among Prominent Women.

The announcement that a dramatization of Elinor Glyn's much talked of love story "Three Weeks" is to be given in this city has aroused a considerable amount of comment from both the local play goers as well as the anti-theatre workers. To

such an extent has the discussion been carried that rumors are current that the local club women intend to start a crusade against the appearance of the piece, on the grounds that the same is unfit for public presentation.

In investigating the rumor a canvass was made today of a number of the more prominent club women and their various expressions regarding the matter were noted, as follows:

One prominent club woman has the following to say: "I see no reason at all why 'Three Weeks' should not be seen and thoroughly enjoyed by the play goers of this city. I've read the book and have no fault to find with it. It is a beautifully written story and dramatization of it could be no worse than nine-tenths of the plays which have been seen here this season. Please understand, however, that I do not wish to pose as an advertiser of 'Three Weeks,' or any other play. You asked my opinion and I have told you."

Another lady had the following to say: "I cannot speak in favor of 'Three Weeks,' either as a story or a play.

I am somewhat familiar with it and I don't think such a play should be allowed to be produced here. If the matter is brought up at any of our club meetings I shall not hesitate to speak against the proposition."

One of our prominent citizens says: "I think 'Three Weeks' is positively indecent and that the dramatization of it should be prohibited. I have not read the book, but I have heard it discussed by ladies who have and whose opinions in such matters I respect. I do not think a story like 'Three Weeks' can serve any good purpose. A close friend of mine in another city stated to me only a short time ago that not only is 'Three Weeks' bad for the young mind to absorb, but that the book was more liable to have a dangerous effect on certain feminine minds of a mature age. I am against the proposed production of it in this city."

"Three Weeks" has aroused as much discussion pro and con as "Mrs. Warren's Profession" did. It appears from advance reports that attempts are made to prohibit the performance nearly everywhere, and in fact in a number of instances it has been successful. Will they stop it here?
