

THE CONSUL WARNS ALL CHINESE

Reports of Threatened War Between Tongs Causes Consul General to Take Strong Action.

New York, July 5.—Instructing Chinese of this city to be courteous to all civilians, and also to the police, flaring red and gold placards, bearing the Imperial insignia of the Chinese consulate, decorate the walls of the Oriental quarters today. The consul's warning is directed at the Hip Sing and On Leong tongs, between whom a civil war is said to be brewing.

The placards read: "To law-abiding citizens, New York: Word having reached the state department that recent developments precipitated the danger of a war between the Hip Sing tong and the On Leong tong, you are hereby warned by the representatives of the Chinese government to remain close to your homes, keep on the lighted streets, not to discharge firecrackers, nor to be out Monday after midnight. Be courteous to all civilians and to the police. The Imperial Chinese Consul."

The state department at Washington received intimation of troubles from the Chinese minister. The local police, in turn, were notified, and extra precautions were taken to prevent a clash, one Chinese was arrested for carrying a loaded revolver. He claimed that he was carrying it to celebrate the Fourth.

WOMAN'S HEAD BEATEN TO PULP

[United Press Leased Wire.]
New York, July 6.—With the head beaten to a pulp and the back and arms covered with bruises, the body of an unknown woman was found in the doorway of a tenement house in Thirteenth street early today. Philip Calla, son of the proprietor of a nearby saloon, has been arrested on suspicion of implication in the crime.

The woman's body was found by Morris Gross, a 12-year-old boy, who was delivering milk.

It was lying on a doorstep which was covered with blood. Tracks from this pool showed that someone had walked around to the rear of the saloon after the woman's death and across the floor to a pool table, where young Calla was found asleep by the officers.

Physicians said the woman had been dead two hours when the boy discovered the body.

Young Calla, who is full grown, denied any knowledge of the crime. He said he heard some scuffling early this morning after he had entered the saloon, but paid no attention to it, and finally went to sleep on the pool table. He declared that while he was asleep the assassin must have walked into the saloon and across to the pool table to throw suspicion upon him.
