A WORD ABOUT AUTO'S

Dr. Morse, in a very temperate and well-written article, takes the Salem papers to task for their position on the driving of autos. The doctor seems to think that an article in The Journal of Friday was a direct attack on all auto drivers, but such an inference cannot be fairly drawn from the article in question. It simply spoke of the danger of turning corners close in, by both auto drivers and bicycle riders. The writer of that article (a reporter, by the way, and not Colonel Hofer, who is down at Burns,) realizes that the auto is here to stay, is a modern convenience, and are already indispensable. He realizes, further, that the great majority of auto drivers are of average caution, and have proper regard for the rights of others. So are the majority of bicycle riders. It was for this very reason that the article in question was written. It is the reckless (not wreckless) autoist, the careless biker that was alluded to, and, as far as the autoists being compelled to carry a pistol to defend themselves, where can such an inference be drawn from the article? Would they use a gun to defend themselves in court against the charge of manslaughter?

The reporter simply called attention to the danger of doing a certain thing, and cautioned autoists about speeding around the corners close in, where they or others had little opportunity to avoid collision. If this was wrong why does the doctor himself suggest precautions about passing teams? Why suggest a series of plain rules, the rules of the road, which are admittedly violated? And further the doctor, after criticizing The Journal reporter, repeats the very caution the reporter had given. He says:

"A vehicle going west on State street and turning north on Commercial should turn the corner close in, as short as possible; should he desire to turn south on Commercial, he should make a wide turn, at least to the center of the street, which would bring him on the right hand side of Commercial in front of the electric light office."

This is exactly what The Journal reporter said, and, he heartily agrees with Dr. Morse that the plain rules of the road, lived up to, would stop all friction between those who use autos and bikes and those who do not, especially if the very sensible suggestion of "giving the horse the best of it," is followed out.

FOREIGN RESIDENTS IN DANGER IN PERSIA

St. Petersburg, July 5.—Communication with Tehran was severed today and grave fears are entertained for the safety of the foreign residents of the Persian capital.

Latest reports received from the besieged city stated that the shah's palace had been fortified with cosacks as it was expected that the rebels would soon make an attack.

The severing of communication leads to the belief today that the rebels have advanced upon and taken the city. As the rebels greatly outnumber the Cosacks defending the shah it is feared that the palace has fallen into their hands.

and goods must be in accordance therewith. Where samples are required and not furnished by bidders, the articles must be equal to samples

seen at the asylum, and the bids will be assumed to have been made on basis of samples. All goods must be in strict accordance with sample in original package. If possible, and delivered at the Insane asylum within 20 days after contract is awarded.

Bids must be in blank form, which will be furnished, together with instructions to bidders, by the clerk, upon application. Each bid on flour or meat must be accompanied by a certified check for \$300, and each bid on fish by a certified check of \$75, and all other bids by certified checks equal to 10 per cent of the amount of the bid; checks of unsuccessful bidders will be returned immediately and those accepted when the contract is completed. Bids must be enclosed in sealed envelopes and directed to the undersigned, and plainly marked on the outside, "Bids for Asylum Supplies," and the class of goods should also be inscribed on the envelope. Price, fitness and quality being equal, preference will be given to articles manufactured, grown or produced in this state.

When a particular article is specifically called for, bids for other kind or manufacturer, or brand equally as good will be entertained, but to insure recognition of such bids, samples of the articles it is proposed to supply must accompany them. The board reserves the right to reject any or all bids, or to accept or reject any part of a bid. Bids will be opened at the executive chambers, in the state capitol, at Salem, Oregon, at 3 p. m. on Tuesday, July 6, 1909.

Auditing officers are hereby prohibited from confirming accounts of purchasers which do not comply with section 2460, chapter X, title XXIV of Beallinger and Cotton's Annotated Codes and Statutes of Oregon.

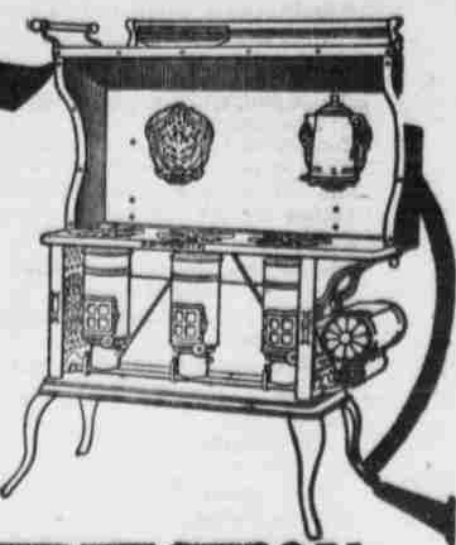
