### KILLED HER BABY AND DRANK POISON

[United Press Leased Wire.] San Francisco, July 8.—Held on a charge of murder, Mrs. Laura McDonald, who killed her baby son, Kenneth, and attempted to end her own life, a few weeks ago, is in the city prison here today. Members of the waitresses' union have enlisted themselves in the cause of the accused woman, and will fight her case in the superior court.

Mrs. McDonald's story is one of misfortune. At the age of 17 she became the wife of John Morrison McDonald, son of a wealthy man in Nova Scotia. They lived at Merceda, Ariz., for a year, and then she was deserted by her husband, who left her to care for their 10-months-old child.

The woman went to Los Angeles, where she met Edwin Crawford, a cook, who brought her to San Francisco. She says he deserted her, and in a fit of despondency she decided to kill her child and herself. She shot the baby and drank poison herself. The child died, but she recovered, and now faces a charge of murder.

"She's only a baby," declared the mother, "and Albert is little more. When I catch him I will put him on bread and water diet until he promises to be good."

A mutual friend of the young couple secured a license for them by representing the bride's age as 18 and the groom's as 21. Reisinger's income as a waiter is \$2.50 a week and the parents are wondering how he will support his wife and himself.

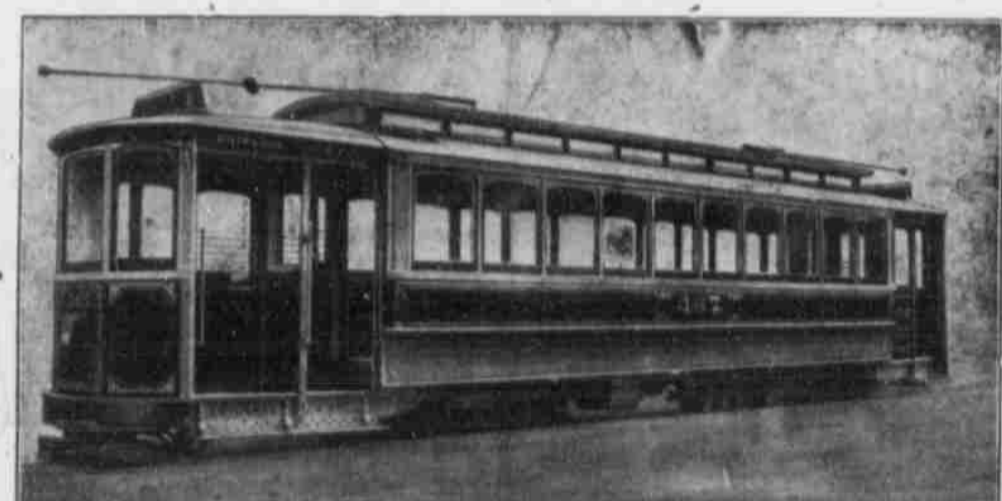
