

CHAMPION BY BREVET KETCHEL

Will Meet Sam Langford at Ely
September 6—Ketchel
Has Already Signed
Articles.

[United Press Leased Wire.]
San Francisco, July 8.—Articles calling for a sincere fight for the middleweight championship of the world between Stanley Ketchel and Sam Langford, at Ely, Nev., on September 6, will be signed on behalf of Ketchel tonight, and with the af-

fixing of his signature, Willie Britt, on behalf of the assassin, will have performed his part of drawing up an agreement whereby his boy will receive the largest guaranteed sum ever given a prize fight. Whether Ketchel wins, loses or draws, according to the articles, he will receive \$25,000. What Langford's portion will be is not known, but it is believed that Tex. Hall, the mining man from Ely, who is promoting the fight, will guarantee the negro \$5,000. As soon as the Ketchel end of the deal is concluded, Hall will send for Langford. The articles stipulate that both men must be at Ely, 30 days before the fight.

Ketchel has busied himself since Monday with plans for his outing in the mountains in the northern part of the state and on Saturday or Sunday he and Britt will set out for a long hunting, fishing, walking and hill-climbing trip in Lake and Mendocino counties.

Britt still insists that Ketchel was not undertrained July 5, claiming on the contrary that if anything was the matter with the champion he was overtrained.

Ketchel cashed in yesterday, receiving from Coffroth a round \$11,-

000 for his fight with Papke. The Thunderbolt arrived in Los Angeles this morning and at once made preparations to go into training at Venice for his fight with Jim Flynn. Papke is in good shape and needs very little work, but his nose, which stopped the most terrific punch delivered by Ketchel on Monday, needs quite a bit of nursing, and it was for this reason that the Keweenaw boy wanted the fight postponed until the 17th.

As soon as he finishes with Flynn, Papke will return to San Francisco, ready to fight Ketchel under any old conditions, side bet, winner take all, or charity.

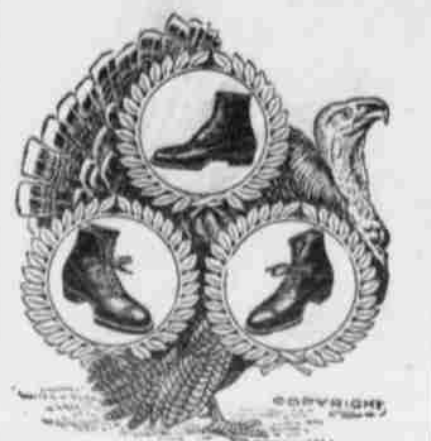
