TWO FOOLS WADED IN AND COME OUT ONE

Shasta Retreat, Cal., July 8.—Wading to their waists in the chill waters of the Sacramento river late yesterday, Miss Violet Pert, daughter of a prominent Colorado Springs family, and W. N. Lynch, of Fruitvale, Cal., joined hands and stood for a moment in the rushing current.

Two minutes later Mr. and Mrs. Lynch climbed dripping and shivering from the water. A Methodist minister, high and dry on the bank, had pronounced the words that made them man and wife.

Neither of the couple would tell the reason for making the bosom of the Sacramento their hymeneal altar, but Mrs. Lynch, as she hastily donned a warm cloak, remarked that the coming year of married life had little chance of equaling the rigors of the few moments necessary for the ceremony.

FELL IN CAULDRON OF BOILING ASPHALT

San Francisco, July 8.—His flesh literally boiled from his bones, when he fell into a vat of boiling asphaltum, Adolph Johnson, a laborer, died at midnight at the Central Emergency Hospital.

Johnson was crossing the seething cauldron of asphaltum on a thin plank. Without warning, the frail bridge broke beneath him, and he was precipitated bodily into the fiery mass. He was extricated with great difficulty by fellow workmen, and hurried to the hospital.

MONTANA HAS ITS OWN BASEBALL LEAGUE

Butte, Mont., July 8.—The Inter-Mountain Baseball league today began its existence as an entire Montana organization.

At a meeting of the league magnates in this city last night the franchise of the Boise, Idaho, club was disposed of to Livingston, Mont., and the Salt Lake franchise was transferred to Bozeman.

The teams now comprising the league are Helena, Butte, Livingston and Bozeman.

TERRIFIC VOLTAGE BURNED HIS SKIN OFF

(United Press Leased Wire.)
Oakland, Cal., July 8.—Though he miraculously escaped death when 65,000 volts of electricity passed through his body late last month, George Hayne, an electrician, must be supplied with 200 inches of new skin, according to the verdict of the physicians who attended him at the Providence hospital.

Almost one-third of the man's skin was seared from his body by the terrific current, and must be replaced with new and healthy cuticle, if he is to live. Yesterday the doctors made their announcement, and immediately 20 members of the local electricians' union volunteered to submit to an operation to save the life of their fellow workman.

Sunday morning these volunteers will report at the hospital, and a small section of skin will be removed from each, to be grafted upon the stricken man. The delicate operation will be performed by Dr. Ergo Majors and Dr. A. A. Alexander.

STANDARD OIL SHIPS BRING IN CHINAMEN

(United Press Leased Wire.)
San Francisco, July 8.—That the Chinese underground railroads are making vehicles of illegal entry of the Standard Oil Company's vessels that visit this port, is alleged to be the startling fact unearthed by special agents of Washington, who are conducting an investigation here.

Many of these vessels, usually sailing under the English or the German flag, make this port from the Orient each year. Each carries in her crew some 50 Chinese sailors. The officials are of the opinion that Chinese agents in this city arrange with many of their countrymen, who have made their fortunes, to replace the Chinese sailors when the Standard vessels leave the port, upon payment of a certain sum from the intrant. This is easy because of the manner of checking the ships upon their arrival and departure.

KILLED HIMSELF AND WIFE MAY DIE

(United Press Leased Wire.)
St. Louis, Mo., July 8.—Deranged from insomnia, Gustav Krause, aged 56 years, attempted to exterminate his family early today, and then committed suicide.

Declaring he would slaughter his 9-year-old son, the crazed man tied him to a bedpost, and then beat his wife into insensibility with the butt of a rifle. The boy managed to free himself and escape from the house, while his father was attacking Mrs. Krause.

When he thought he had killed his wife, Krause leaned upon the muzzle of the gun and discharged it with his toe, killing himself instantly.

Mrs. Krause regained consciousness and staggered into the yard, where she was found by neighbors, who had been summoned by the little boy. She was taken to a hospital and is in a critical condition.

A German specialist has found that Krause is suffering from partial insanity, and that it can be relieved, but not cured.

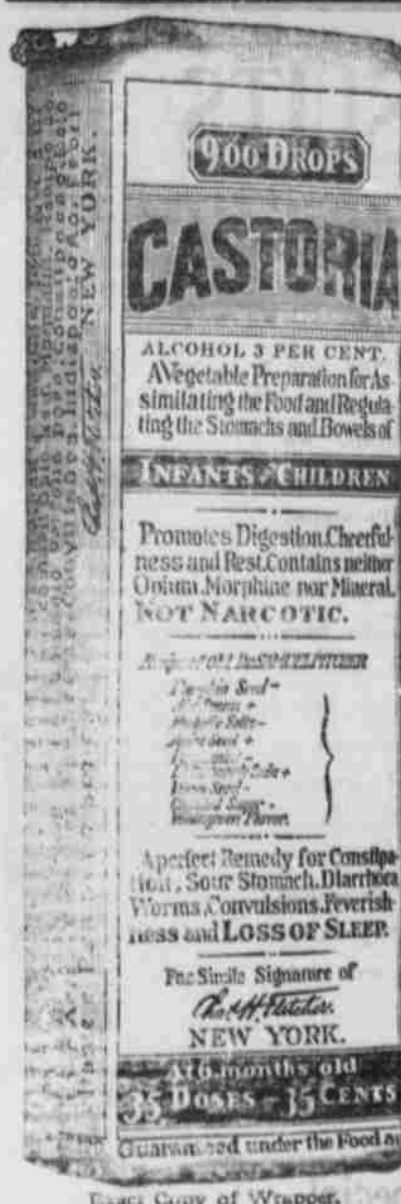
