PORTLAND MAN SHOT ON STREET

He Says It Was Thugs, But
Witnesses Say There Was
a Woman in the Case

[United Press Leased Wire.]
Portland, Or., July 15.—While R. F. Brackett, member of the firm of Brackett & Meyers, electrical engineers, is thought to be dying today, the police are engaged in what looks like a hopeless task in trying to unravel the mystery surrounding a shooting affair in which he received a bullet wound in the left abdominal region.

Brackett insists that two men ran from behind a tree late last night while he was walking on Yamhill street near Fourteenth, and commanded him to throw up his hands. He says that a moment later one of the men shot him. A different phase is given by three witnesses. They agree with the theory of the police, that the woman Brackett is supposed to have met near the scene of the shooting figured in the subsequent developments.

R. E. Dent, an employee of some stables in the neighborhood, told the police that a man resembling Brackett met a woman at Yamhill and Fourteenth streets an hour before he was shot. Attracted by the report of the revolver, Dent looked out and saw two well-dressed men run past the stables. A hurried search of Brackett's clothes showed that no attempt had been made to rob him. Mrs. Ward, who resides near the corner where the shooting occurred, says that when she rushed from her back door she heard some one say: "Well, I guess you've got me this time." Brackett is supposed to have made this remark. She also saw two men, who did not look like highwaymen, run from the scene. In spite of this evidence, Brackett still maintains that he was attacked by thugs. His wife is at present in Walla Walla.



THIRTEEN DROWN IN SUBMARINE

Collides with Unknown Vessel
and Wrecks—Accident
Occurs this Morning.

Sheerness, England, July 15.—One British submarine was wrecked and sunk in the bottom of the English channel, causing the loss of 15 lives, and another was seriously damaged in a collision today, according to wireless dispatches received here. Reports of the collision are conflicting, and the details of the disaster are not known.

According to the advice the submarine C 11, with 15 men aboard, is lying wrecked at the bottom of the channel. The C 17, with which the wrecked vessel is said to have collided, is reported to be hurrying to Yarmouth to have serious damages attended to.

Later it was ascertained that 13 men were drowned when the submarine C 11 went to the bottom of the channel, and that both C 11 and C 17 were damaged by a collision with a third vessel, the name of which has been learned. The collision occurred during the naval maneuvers in the channel this morning.

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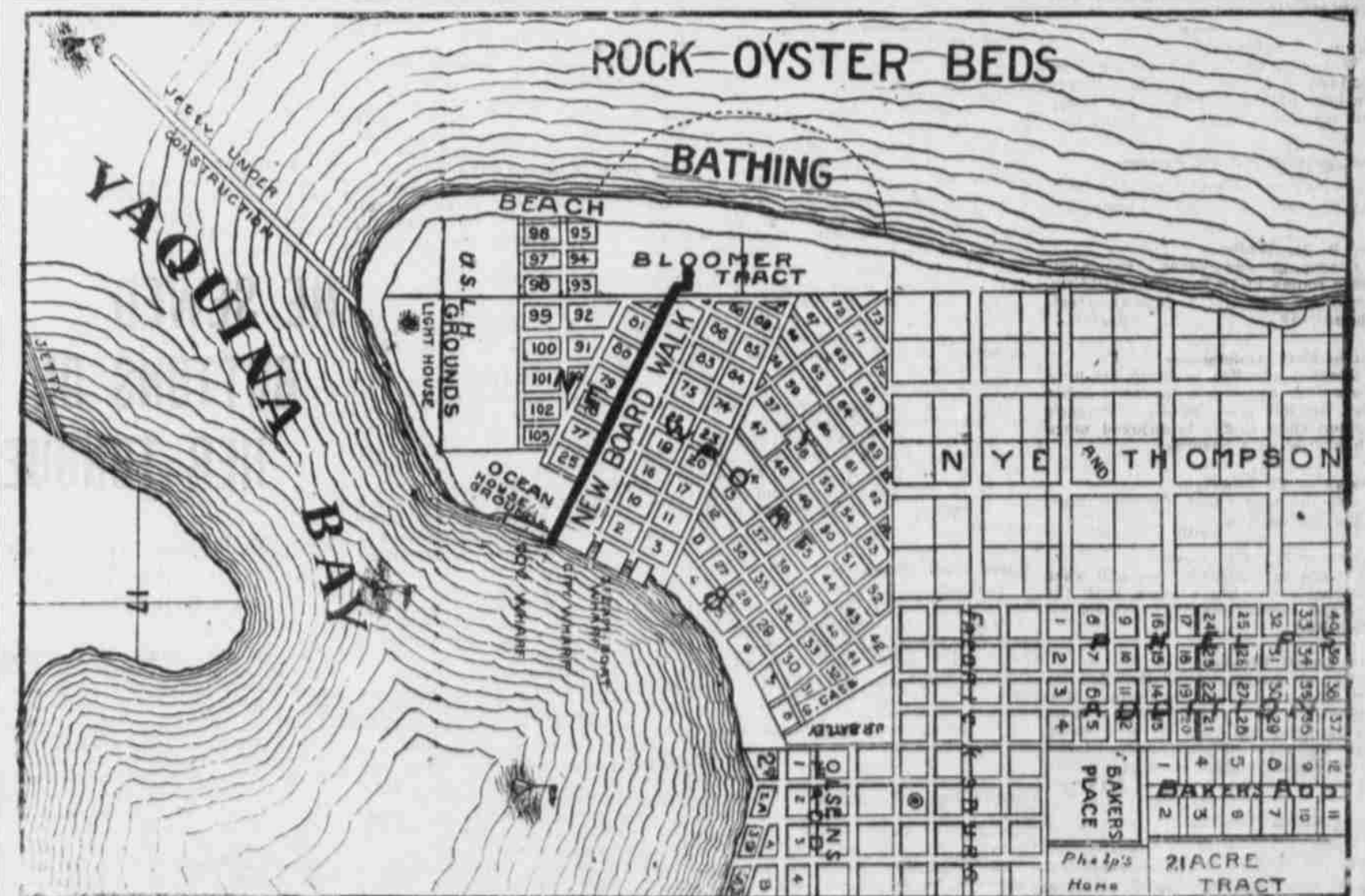

STUDY THE ABOVE MAP

BLOOMER'S ADDITION to the City of Newport, Oregon, is now on the market for the first time.
