SAME OLD STORY OF CANDY AND THE KIDS

[United Press Leased Wire.] Seattle, Wash., July 16.—Candy is working appalling results among school children, according to a statement by Dr. E. O'Connell, of Seattle, before the convention of the Washington State Dental Society, in session in this city.

"There is not a school house in the city that is not surrounded with at least half a dozen candy shops," said Dr. O'Connell, "and to this fact must be attributed the prevalence of bad teeth among the city children."

"What we need to do is to thoroughly educate everyone in the use of the various prophylactic measures. People should be taught the use of the tooth brush. In teaching them the care of their teeth, we can do more good than with the finest mechanical skill, after they are spoiled."

This morning's session of the society was given over to addresses and discussion of technical matter pertaining to the dental profession, and this afternoon clinics will be held.

THE EDITORS GO SIGHT SEEING

The business session of the newspaper men will be far enough apart to permit them to enjoy the exposition. This evening an informal luncheon will be given the visitors on the exposition grounds by James A. Wood, director of exploitation, and the evening will be spent on the "Pay Streak."

SAYS SALVATION IS IN PAYING WIFE

[United Press Leased Wire.] Berkeley, Cal., July 15.—That a partial solution of the problem arising from the entry of women into business may be found in a system providing payment for housewives for domestic services rendered; is the opinion of Mrs. Ellen Richards, instructor of chemistry at the Massachusetts Institute of Technology. During the course of a lecture before the students of the University of California Summer School yesterday, Mrs. Richards said: "We must come to a correct valuation of the work done by women in the home. It is because no economic value has been placed on this work that women have turned to vocations that bring recompense. Women do not seek environments other than the home, because they are more pleasant, on the contrary, they take up occupations less agreeable because in them their efforts are appreciated and rewarded."

[United Press Leased Wire.] Sacramento, July 16.—Heir to a fortune of \$20,000, James Murphy, serving a sentence in the state penitentiary at Folsom for horse stealing, has launched a campaign to gain a parole so that he may enjoy his legacy.

Murphy was sent to Folsom for stealing a horse from the sheriff's stables in San Francisco. He was sentenced to three years. Before the expiration of his sentence he escaped and repeated his crime. He was given three additional years. Recently a wealthy relative of Murphy died in Los Angeles, bequeathing him \$25,000. District Attorney Eugene Washburn of this city has interested himself in Murphy's case.
