# SPECTER AMONG NEGROES

America's Worst Drug Habit Is a More Menacing Portent Than Whiskey.

[United Press Leased Wire.] Chicago, July 22.—Inroads of the cocaine habit, which the Currier Commission has found to be the American curse, as opium is the curse of China, and hemp of India, have suddenly developed into a new and ominous phase of the race problem in the United States, particularly in the South.

"Cocaine now ranks with whiskey as the chief provocative of rape, and its consequent lynching bee in the South," declares Charles W. Collins and John Day, of the commission, in a preliminary report just published in full by the Chicago magazine "Everyday Life." They add: "Already among the 'fends' and the policemen who have to deal with them, there is talk of 'the new field.' The phase, with its commercial suggestion, comes from the dealers in the drugs, retailers and perhaps wholesalers also. Every 'fend,' it should be added, is more than likely to be a peddler of the 'stuff,' taking his commission in the same misery that he distributes. This 'new field' is among the brutalized negroes of the South, who, denied easy access to liquor by the prohibition movement, are turning to drugs as a substitute."

The commission quotes from Hampton's magazine an article by Judge Harris Dickson, of Vicksburg, Miss., who told of a contractor who ordered a pound of cocaine, to the astonishment of the salesman to whom the order was given, who expostulated, saying: "No man on earth can possibly want that much cocaine." The contractor reiterated the order. "A man who deliberately puts cocaine into a negro is more dangerous than he who would inoculate a dog with hydrophobia," commented Judge Dickson. "The deadly drug arouses every evil passion, gives the negro superhuman strength, and destroys his sense of fear. Yet the steambot negro and the levee negro will not work without. So the levee contractor makes his camp look like a cross-section of hell, but he gets the dirt moved."

**DIED WHILE TRYING TO BURY ANOTHER**

North Yakima, Wash., July 22.—H. K. Sinclair, affectionately known throughout the Yakima valley as "Uncle Hugh," is dead here, as the result of a stroke of apoplexy, attributed to the unusual exertion of going to town to solicit contributions to bury another old man who had died without leaving money enough to defray his funeral expenses. All day "Uncle Hugh," who was 68 years old, trotted about the streets on his charitable mission, and retired apparently in his usual health. Early in the morning he was stricken with paralysis, and died a few hours later.

# CHIEF LET HIM DEPART

"If He Lived in Boswell, Pa., He Has Been Punished Enough," Said the Chief.

[United Press Leased Wire.] San Francisco, July 22.—Refusal of the chief of police of Boswell, Pa., to pay \$2.20 for a telegram notifying him of the arrest of George Johnson, self-confessed burglar, resulted in the release of the prisoner. Chief of Police Cook, of San Francisco, who compelled to pay for the dispatch, raised his right hand today and solemnly vowed "never again."

Johnson recently became conscious stricken, and late yesterday surrendered himself to the local police, saying that he was wanted in Boswell for burglary. After listening to his story, Chief Cook wired to the Boswell chief, notifying him that the man was under arrest. Several hours later the chief was astonished when the company sent word that the eastern chief had refused payment on message. Cook produced the required \$2.20, and, summoning Johnson, said:

"If you ever lived in Boswell you have been sufficiently punished. You may go."

According to Johnson's story he eloped from Boswell with a woman named Beale. Before leaving the town he burglarized his brother's house, stealing \$500. He took the woman to Idaho, where she deserted him. He came to California, but his conscience troubled him, and he finally gave himself up to the police.

**NO MORE FREAK NAMES FOR POSTOFFICES**

[United Press Leased Wire.] Seattle, Wash., July 22.—According to information just received from the postoffice department at Washington, an edict has gone forth that the day of freak postoffice names is past. No more Yubalams, Peekaboos, Pinkhook Landing, Black Ducks, Yellow Dogs, Blue Earths or Thief River Falls will be tolerated. Tennessee formerly was the banner freak postoffice state, according to the postal authorities, but many of the names have been changed, and now honors are divided between the Western and Southern states. More seriousness in the selection of postoffice names is desired, and the Tennessee mountaineer and the Western plainsman, who took delight in choosing the most freakish names that imagination could suggest, will in the future have to get the sanction of the postoffice department for the name before it becomes official.
