He then died and she then married August Stubbs and lived near Oxford, Ohio. Soon after I was born my father died and my mother very sick with dropsy took me and went to Chicago, Ill., where she was nursed by Mary I. Alexander. At the request of my grandfather, who is now dead, I was given to my aunt to raise and my mother was sent to a hospital in the east by my grandfather, where she is said to have died with dropsy along

in the early eighties, but just when and where I don't know.

I want to find and hear from Kate Herman, the sister of my mother's first husband, who was in Chicago a few years ago; also Ralph Talbot, late of Davenport, Iowa; also my aunt who raised me and any other persons who knew my mother, Pauline Stubbs, when she died and where buried.

My grandfather is dead. Outsiders are taking his property and claim I am not his grandchild. The people I am hunting for know who I am. Please help me to find them. I am helpless unless you help me and I find these people. Please publish, and other papers please copy, one or more times. For this I will thank you a thousand times.
