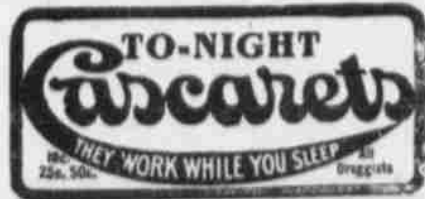

Lake Minnetonka, Minn., July 24.—Pacific coast racquet-wielders, who are on their way to participate in the national tennis tournaments on the Atlantic seaboard, astounded local followers of the court game by sweeping everything in sight in the semi-final events of the Northwestern tennis tournament here yesterday.

The surprise of the day was the handy defeat administered to the crack Waldner and Emerson by Tom Bandy and Simpson Sinsabaugh, of Los Angeles. After winning the first set 7-5, the Californians romped over their supposedly invincible opponents, taking the next two 6-3 and 6-4.

McLaughlin and George Jane, of San Francisco, won easily from the McQuiston Brothers, of Mexico, in the doubles. They meet Bunday and Sinsabaugh in the finals today.

Young McLaughlin, whose sensational work has set the tennis enthusiasts here agog, will meet Emerson in the singles final late today.

TEN INDICEMENTS AGAINST OFFICER

(United Press Leased Wire.)

Chicago, July 24.—Ten indictments were returned by the grand jury against Police Inspector Edward McCann, one of the highest officials in the police department. McCann is in charge of the West Side levee district.

The indictments charge McCann with malfeasance of office in accepting bribes. They were returned in connection with the investigation which is being made into conditions in the police department. It is alleged that high police officials and a number of officers on the force have accepted money for protecting dives and saloons.

The grand jury adjourned at noon without returning more indictments. It is reported that Louis Frank has been offered immunity if he will

turn state's evidence. Frank was indicted yesterday on a charge of accepting money and promising to secure protection from police raids for dives.

The indictments are creating a tremendous sensation here. It is rumored that they may possibly reach the city hall.

Detective Griffin, who was indicted yesterday has not been located. He was suspended from the force today by Acting Chief Scheutler, pending his trial. It is thought that he will be placed under arrest before night.

Kenosha Strike Ended.

Kenosha, Wis., July 24.—Work was resumed in all departments of the Allen tannery today. Although the strike has not been formally settled it is believed to be practically over.

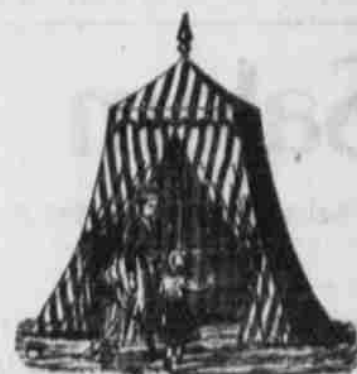
