INSPECTING THE BLACK EAGLE MINES

Prospects Growing Better in These Already Well-Known Ore Regions.

(Journal Special.)

E. G. Morgan of Lebanon and M. M. Shifer left Lebanon last Friday for the Black Eagle mining district on the Little North Fork of the Santiam river. They drove over going by way of Jordan, Gates and Elkhorn, which is the last hamlet on the road to the mines. From Elkhorn they followed up the Little North Fork to the mines. The road is now open and in good shape to within about half a mile of the mines when it reaches the ore-bearing canyon. The mines are located fourteen miles from Gates. It is eight miles from Gates to Elkhorn and six miles further to the mines.

The mines are located about forty rods north of the main Little North Fork on a mountain stream called Horn creek, and is in a deep canyon, and is very accessible with a fine road built by the mining company almost to the very mouth of the mine. There is now a dump of crushed mineral ore consisting of about 1500 tons at the mouth of the tunnels, and enough to keep a smelter busy for many months with the additional ore piled out daily from the deep tunnels. There are three tunnels in the mountain side, one being in about 100 feet, one 450 feet, and the other 650 feet. The latter two start from a common mouth. After extending about 50 feet they fork on an angle of about 30 degrees, one extending 400 feet and the other 500 feet from the point of divergence. The two tunnels are 1500 feet below the surface of the hill and the larger one is 1500 feet below the smaller tunnel. It is the purpose of the company to sink a shaft from the head of the deeper tunnel to connect with the upper one to fully ascertain just what is in the mountain side and to locate the best vein of ore.

There is now open a seven-foot vein of good ore in the upper small tunnel. There is a crew of men now working in the mines and the prospects are getting better every day for ore in the dump. He brought out some fine specimens from these tunnels and some he picked out of the ore dump. These specimens have been attracting a great deal of attention by those who understand the worth of mineral ores.

They returned Sunday night by the same route they went in over, and are jubilant over the work in the mines and the quality of the ore which it produces.

Mr. Morgan was surprised at the amount of work that has been done in these mines and the amount of ore in the dump. He brought out some fine specimens from these tunnels and some he picked out of the ore dump. These specimens have been attracting a great deal of attention by those who understand the worth of mineral ores.
