

STEAMSHIP WAR
MAY BE RESULT

San Francisco, July 28.—It is strongly rumored among steamship men today that the operating agreement existing between the Pacific Mail Company and the Japanese line, Toyo Kisen Kaisha, is about to be terminated.

Color to the report is lent by the departure of W. H. Avery, assistant general manager of the American line, on the Tenyo Maru for Japan.

Before departing, Avery stated that he was going to attend a directors' meeting of the Japanese company at Yokohama, and that the question of the termination of the present agreement would be discussed.

R. P. Schwerin, vice-president of the Pacific Mail, declares that he has no knowledge of the reported rupture. He says the Japanese have been getting the better of the agreement, and have no cause for dissatisfaction.

Both men are suffering from fractured skulls, and injuries which may prove fatal.

The store was crowded with women at the time, and a panic was narrowly averted.
