CHEMAWA INDIAN SCHOOL GRADUATING EXERCISES

LARGE ATTENDANCE FROM THIS CITY AND SPLENDID PROGRAM WITH MANY PRACTICAL FEATURES.

The annual graduation exercises at the Salem Indian school was concluded Thursday night. There had been something doing since Sunday. The gymnasium building was decorated as for a war—there were 21 graduates and they were scattered through 17 nations. There was a large attendance of Salem people.

On top of a great big literary and musical program, that was still quite simple and unaffected—no cantatas or other musical complications—there was much of the practical. There were cooking demonstrations in chafing dishes—a Kootenai maiden with languishing eyes cooked tomato soup that made the young braves' mouths water.

The company drills Thursday morning were unusually good. Capt. McCully's company got 92 points; C company by Capt. Darnell, made 90—the smallest company. About 300 boys drilled in full uniforms mostly made in the school under direction of Col. J. F. Enright, chief of the tailor department.

There was a baseball game between the graduates and the employees, 3 to 3 for the grads. Tenbo, Smith, Lieurance, Larson, Swaboda, Van Tassel, Cooper and Pickel are no match for boys with diplomas. An enrollment of 775, actual attendance averaged 615, with highest attendance 647, was in spite of adverse regulations.

Pringle said was the finest ever heard by him in an Indian school. An eastern lady, from Des Moines, Iowa, laughed when she saw that number on the program. She was a graduate of Drake university music school but she changed her comment into praise when she heard the Indians sing.

The graduating program was also strong in musical numbers. Thomas McNally told what graduates from this school are doing in the world. All were surprised at the long roll-call of useful men and women sent out from here. Levi Sortor read a good paper on practical farms. Many of these Indian boys and girls own land and are taught how to handle stock and grow crops.

RAILROAD COMPANY TO PROTECT FOREST.
