Washington, Aug. 2.—The tariff bill was received by the senate from the house at 10 o'clock this morning. Senator Aldrich immediately had the conference committee's report laid before the senate and read. The reading of the conference report required three hours and 25 minutes. Senator Daniel then, on behalf of the Democrats, argued that the report was not legally before the senate. He said it was not put before a properly constituted committee, because the Democrats on the committee were not allowed to share in the debate.

INCOME TAX WILL BE VOTED UPON IN OREGON

The secretary of state of the United States has forwarded to Governor Benson a certified copy of the income tax amendment to the constitution of the United States that is to be submitted to a vote of the state legislatures when they meet. If ratified by three-fourths of them it will become a part of the fundamental law.

THEY FIND THE STOLEN DIAMONDS

San Francisco, Aug. 2.—A letter from detectives in Seattle, addressed to Thomas Lundy, whose jewelry shop was robbed of \$50,000 worth of diamonds last winter, has started the local police on the trail of the diamond thieves once more. Several days ago Lundy received the communication in which it was stated that the Seattle detectives knew who the robbers were and that the burglars would be arrested and

convicted by the organization. The offer was made with the proviso that Lundy enter into an agreement to pay a certain sum and a certain percent of the valuation of the stolen gems. The \$5,000 reward offered by the jeweler will not be considered at all by the mysterious authors of the letter.

It was intimated in the epistle that the treasure is buried near San Francisco and that the thieves have intentions of digging it up.

that the rebels are holding their own against the troops.

Official reports that "Barcelona is quiet" are learned to be based on the fact that the central district of the city is under control of the troops. The rebels remain active in the other portions of the city and lawlessness reigns in a much larger territory than that which has been subdued by the soldiers.

Fighting was renewed in the outer portions of the city today and the death list is said to be heavy. Reports that 3500 persons have been killed and wounded in Barcelona alone are believed to be true. In other cities in the province of Catalonia the death lists have been proportionately heavy.

More victories for the Moors, who are besieging the Spanish army at Melilla, are reported today and the troops are said to have lost heavily.

Trouble at Madrid, where a mob hissed the king a few days ago, is anticipated. Rumors that a general strike, like that at Barcelona, in protesting against the continuation of the war in Morocco, will be declared, reached here today.

Hundreds of rioters have been arrested in various cities throughout Spain and a large number of executions took place at Barcelona today.

Murder and Robbery Everywhere. Henday, France, Aug. 2.—News smuggled through the frontier today says that the revolution is spreading rapidly and that anarchy is prevailing throughout the entire province of Catalonia. The rebels are pillaging and sacking villages, burning houses and killing stock. A big French factory at Palamos was burned by the rebels today. The messages

say that the whole countryside is in a state of terror.

Wounded Are Murdered.

Paris, Aug. 2.—Thousands of refugees are arriving on the French frontier, having fled for their lives from Barcelona, bringing the most terrible tales of distress and suffering.

The refugees say that more than 2000 persons have been shot down and killed in the streets of Barcelona and that hundreds of wounded rebels, unable to escape, are hiding in the city.

Whenever the wounded are found by the soldiers they are quickly dispatched. Those who have made their way to the frontier are without shelter, money or food, and have been forced to throw themselves on the mercy of the French.
