

A LULL IN FIGHTING AT MELILLA

[United Press Leased Wire.] Madrid, Aug. 4.—Comparative quiet reigns at Melilla today, according to advices received here. The government believes that the worst of the fighting is over and that the tide has turned in favor of the Spaniards.

General Marina reported today that he did not expect to make any aggressive movement for several days, but that at the end of that time he would again attack the Moors. The tribesmen hold a strong position on the mountain and the Spaniards have met disastrous reverses in attempting to storm them. Marina is confident now, however, that he will be able to take the enemy and is preparing for another attack. His message stated that he

did not expect so great opposition as he encountered before and that the fighting would soon be over.

EIGHT HORSES BURN AT INDIAN AGENCY

Eight head of the best horses belonging to the agency on the Umatilla Indian reservation were burned to death in a fire which destroyed the barn and granary at the agency a few minutes after 10 o'clock Saturday night. The loss will probably exceed \$5,000 or \$6,000, though Major Swartzlander has not yet been able to make out an estimate.

In addition to the horses and buildings, 1,000 bushels of wheat, a large quantity of hay, and all the harness belonging to the establishment were destroyed. Since the government carries no insurance, the loss is total. Not the slightest clue to the cause of the fire has been obtained and it bids fair to remain an unexplained mystery.

Enoch D. Sloan, who crossed the plains to Linn county in 1853, died at Albany August 2. He was a carpenter at Warm Springs and Kramath.

\$1,250,000 IS VOTED FOR ROADS

San Diego, Cal., Aug. 4.—By an approximate vote of four to one the bond election to appropriate a million and a quarter dollars for the construction of a system of highways in San Diego county was carried at the polls yesterday.

The highways will be constructed under the supervision of a commission composed of E. W. Scripps, A. G. Spaulding and John D. Spreckels, who have given their services gratuitously to the county.

With the completion of this modern system, San Diego county will be the possessor of a network of roadways second to none in the west. The actual work of construction will be started as soon as is practicable.
