SUCCESSFUL EXCURSION TO NEW TOWN ON THE WEST SIDE---BROADMEAD

The excursion of the Columbia Trust company to the new town and garden tracts known as Broadmead that have been laid off at Sheridan Junction, about sixteen miles west of Salem, on the west side lines of the Southern Pacific, last Saturday was a striking illustration of the success of modern town building and supplying the wants of homesteaders. About 500 people attended, a barbecue was served and as only 300 had been planned for autos had to be sent to McMinnville for more provisions to feed the multitude. The Amity brass band played and the new town started off with three buildings. There was a crowd like at a county fair and about \$30,000 worth of the property was sold. There will be another excursion in a few days when it is expected twice as much will be sold. About three thousand acres have been cut up into small tracts for intensive farming, such as onions, gardening, small fruit, and walnuts. This company is developing a number of such producing centers that will market their stuff direct in Portland to the consumers. Portland is growing faster than the suburban producing population.

This feature of the Oregon situation was discussed by T. O. Hague,

who came out from the east recently to tell how the big cities of New York are fed by the interior valleys. It is the valley that have made St. Louis and New Orleans and are making Portland. He predicted that it is the valleys that have made continuous garden some day. When the Panama canal is built the populations of Europe will swarm to this coast, and build up many big cities, and the productive soils of the valleys will be worth a thousand dollars an acre. Broadmead is located at the old railroad junction at the point of three railroad lines with Dallas, Sheridan and McMinnville nearly equidistant, but Sheridan nearest, only about six miles away.

Peterson brothers have put in a \$10,000 stock of merchandise, a restaurant has gone up. G. W. Hains of Ballston is putting in a hardware store, a school has been organized. Henshell & Henshell are putting in a store. Rev. Whirry of McMinnville and J. F. Bashor of Amity are organizing a Baptist church, and a town is springing up as if by magic.

RINGLING BROTHERS CIRCUS

Will Be Here Thursday, August
26—Greatest of all the
Great Tented Shows.

Ringling Brothers' brigade of "billers" was in the city today heralding the coming to Salem on Thursday, August 26, of the greatest show ever organized since the first day of time.

The aggregation will come in 85 double length railroad cars and is scheduled to arrive not later than 5 o'clock on the morning of the exhibition day. This year the Ringling enterprise is of such gigantic size that local merchants have been called upon to furnish 450 bushels of oats, 25 tons of hay, 10 tons of straw and meat, bread and other food stuff sufficient to afford 1280 persons three meals.

In the program which the quintet of brothers are presenting appear 375 performers who have never before been seen in America. The feats and features are fresh and sensational in the extreme and embrace 20 headliners that were the talk of Europe last winter.

From Germany have come a trio of the earth's strongest men who rival the herculean power of Samson. The members of this trio do everything from juggling 250-pound dumbbells to supporting a heavy structure over which is driven a ponderous automobile carrying six passengers.

Then there are the Schumann horses that smoke pipes, waltz on their hind legs, drink from large glasses and roll one another about in huge casks; Kerslake's elephants that talk with one another, employing huge telephones with the skill of a human; Kerslake's porkines that walk the rope, climb ladders, turn somersaults and shoot the chutes.

The Lorch family, a troupe of 10 European acrobats, are an attraction it took years to negotiate and cost a great sum of money before being induced to leave their native soil for a tour of America. This great group

is without question the most remarkable and novel offering ever presented on this side of the ocean, and embraces the only living acrobats who have accomplished the seemingly impossible feat of somersaulting twice from the feet of a "cater" to the back of a running horse.

From France has come the greatest thriller of the age. It consists of a pretty young Frenchwoman's daredevil race down 150 feet of sheer incline in a ponderous automobile. Down, down the whizzing monster dashes at a terrible rate of speed, then it strikes an upward curve at the incline's terminal and shoots into space. Up, up it climbs until within a few feet of the canvas roof, where it dips and describes two complete mid-air somersaults before righting and alighting upon a distant platform.

The street parade which distinguishes Ringling Brothers' circus will leave the show grounds on show day morning at 10 o'clock. Most of the 108 cages and dens will be open, showing the wild animal occupants. The pageant is more than three miles in length and represents an outlay of one million dollars.

He was elected to the presidency yesterday by the national congress in session here.

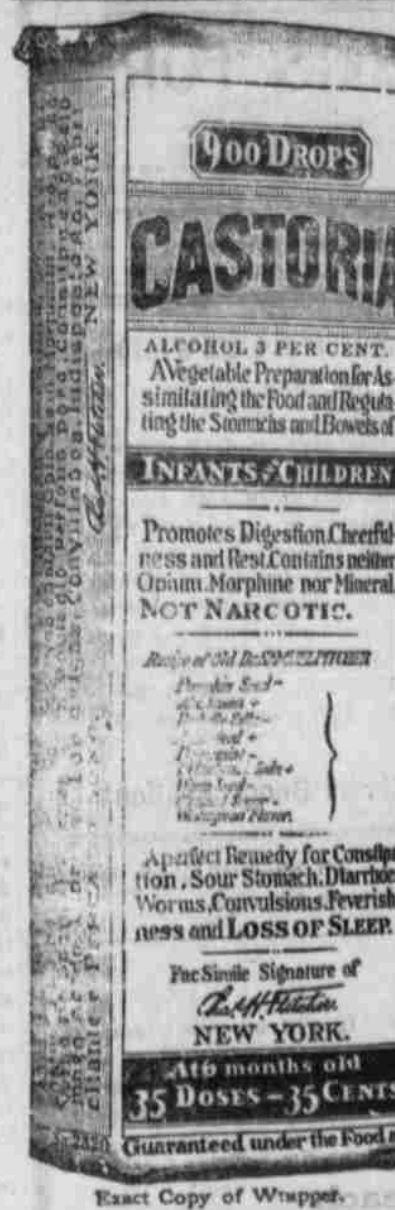
Valencia succeeds General Rafael Reyes, who resigned recently by cable from Europe.
