IT LOOKS BRIGHTER FOR THAW

[United Press Leased Wire.] White Plains N. Y., Aug. 5.—Attorney Morschauer, for Harry K. Thaw, today began an attack upon the character of the late Stanford White in an effort to show that Thaw's beliefs about the alleged practices of White were based on evidence and not delusions.

Through Handwriting Expert Carvelho he introduced a packet of letters alleged to have been written by Stanford White to "Sue" Parker, a young girl who later made an affidavit that she was lured by White to the "Eagle's Nest" and ruined.

It is reported here today that the letters to and from "Sue" Parker were bought by Thaw's attorneys for \$500.

Cross-examining the witness, Jerome attacked the character of "Sue". He also made the witness admit that none of the letters from "Sue" referred to the assault upon her.

Carvalho said that the girl's story impressed him as having been true from the manner in which it was related.

Attorney Morschauer then read from the records of a lunacy commission which declared Thaw to be sane.

PASSED POOR WORK ON BATTLESHIPS

[United Press Leased Wire.] Vallejo, Cal., Aug. 6.—A decision is expected soon from the board of inquiry at Mare Island, which has been investigating the complaints made by the commanders of the cruisers California, West Virginia, South Dakota and Maryland to the navy department against the manner in which certain repairs had been made to their respective ships.

When the board convened, Commander Clarence Carr, of the engineering department, and Edward Kavanaugh, foreman of the boiler repair department, were haled before the board and asked to explain. It was charged that the condensing apparatus of the California was working poorly and that the work had been passed and the vessel declared seaworthy.

Carr and Kavanaugh are said to be the men who passed the work.

LOBSTERS ARE GREAT FIGHTERS

According to Consul General David P. Wilber of Halifax, the Canadian government is having a lot of trouble in trying to propagate the Nova Scotia lobster on the Pacific coast. The trouble is due to the pugnacious nature of the lobster, who, lobster though he is, insists on fighting at the drop of the hat, so to speak.

It is an interesting story Consul General Wilber tells, and it bears no earmarks of a nature fake. He says a consignment of 2,000 live lobsters left Halifax for Vancouver the first week in May. They were shipped by the marine and fisheries department for the purpose of propagating the lobster on the Pacific coast. Mr. Wilber says an attempt was made last year to ship lobsters west, "but owing to their pugnacious tendencies they arrived at their destination in a mangled condition."

It appears a later attempt was made, plugs being placed between the claws to prevent disastrous fighting. The plugs were not removed when the lobsters were planted in the Pacific waters, and consequently the second attempt also proved a failure.

In making the third and last shipment every precaution has been taken by the authorities. The several dozen crates were placed in a special baggage car in charge of two men. Each crate is filled with several compartments, each of which will accommodate one large lobster. Salt water, ice and seaweed were placed in the crates, the top of each crate being fitted with an ice pack and a percolating salt water tank. Where two small lobsters were packed into one berth they were so placed that they could not bite each other.

The lobster industry has never flourished on the Pacific as in the Halifax region, and a strong effort is being made to put it on a firm foundation.

FLOATED TOO MANY WORTHLESS CHECKS

Los Angeles, Aug. 6.—Alleged to have floated worthless checks aggregating a sum in excess of \$1,000, W. L. Geisinger, former drug clerk in Berkeley, is detained today in the city jail. Geisinger was captured in Galveston and returned to this city by Deputy United States Marshal B. H. Franklin, after a chase that led half way across the continent and over a greater part of the broad state of Texas.

Three checks, aggregating \$395, drawn on the First National bank of Berkeley and passed at a local bank, are attributed to Geisinger's handiwork. A woman employe at the bank who had seen the man cash large checks in Berkeley complied when he appealed to her for identification. The alleged operations occurred about six months ago. In January Geisinger, leaving a wife and baby, it was reported by the police fled to Texas. Deputy Franklin captured him at San Antonio, but the prisoner escaped. He was recaptured at Galveston.

Chief Vollmer of the Berkeley police department was notified today of Geisinger's capture by the local authorities.
