BIGGEST CIRCUS COMING.

Ringling Brothers Are Booked for an Early Date in Salem.

The best news of the day is the announcement that on Thursday, August 26, Ringling Brothers world's greatest show will visit Salem, bringing the self same organization of foreign talent that electrified the city of New York during the opening engagement of the circus in Madison Square Garden.

This is Ringling Brothers' twenty-sixth year in the business. Ten years ago they had the greatest show on earth and this year they are twice as big and ten times as good as then.
