HE DOESN'T LIKE HIS QUARTERS

Millionaire Bradbury Wants to Fix Up Business Office in Jail—Wants a Telephone.

San Rafael, Cal., Aug. 6.—Notwithstanding his objections to leaving the private cell for the main jail, Millionaire William Bradbury was taken from the woman's cell he has occupied and placed in one of the larger cells of the jail today. His cellmate is a man who is accused of assault to commit murder. After Bradbury had placed in his new quarters he stated that he wanted privacy.

"I hoped to fix up my cell as an office so I could transact some important business deals I have on," he said angrily.

Later he was granted his request for a desk and Sheriff Taylor aided by Bradbury and jail attendants, moved a large roll-top desk into the barred room occupied by the aged prisoner. Bradbury then wanted a telephone installed, but the sheriff would not allow him to have it.

Another disappointment was in store for the prisoner this morning when the sheriff took from him a silver bell which he had purchased to ring for the jailer when he desired to send a telegram or postal order.

Bradbury has had a number of objections regarding his treatment in the prison and has asked privileges almost constantly. Sheriff Taylor said that Bradbury will receive the same treatment accorded any other prisoner.

TWO DAYS IN JAIL FOR OTHER FELLOW

Tacoma, Aug. 6.—William Ranft, who has just been released from the city jail, where he had been confined for two days, realizes that there are pleasanter things in life than having a double.

Ranft was arrested on a warrant issued at the instance of Louis Cuyrean, and when he was arraigned in police court he was identified by the complainant as the man who had stolen a quantity of launch tools. The prisoner declared that he was innocent and that he was satisfied that a man that looked like him was the guilty party. So earnestly did he talk that the police judge decided to give time for further investigation. Two detectives were detailed on the case and they arrested Wm. Lewis, finding some of the stolen property in his possession. The resemblance between the two men was most striking. Lewis was convicted today and sent to jail, while his double walked out of the court room in a dazed condition.

MULLANEY REFUSES OFFICE OF CHIEF

Chicago, Aug. 6.—"Not for mine," said Bernard J. Mullaney, former police reporter, present secretary to Mayor Busse and all around political general, when asked today why he didn't accept the mayor's tender of the police chieftainship of this city.

Mullaney had one or two good reasons of his own for not accepting the billet, and he had two or three official reasons for declining the position of superintendent of police. One of these was that the term of office was too short in which to accomplish a general reorganization of the police force. One of his personal reasons is that Mullaney realizes he has no police training to fit him for the work.

Mayor Busse, however, has not given up hope of persuading Mullaney to accept the berth and therefore is holding the office open for a few days in the hope that his secretary will change his mind.

Each clash was more serious than the previous and the situation is more critical than ever before.

The streets of the city are littered with garbage and there is general lack of sanitation, owing to the refusal of all men employed in keeping the city clean to turn a hand. The danger of an epidemic is increasing rapidly.

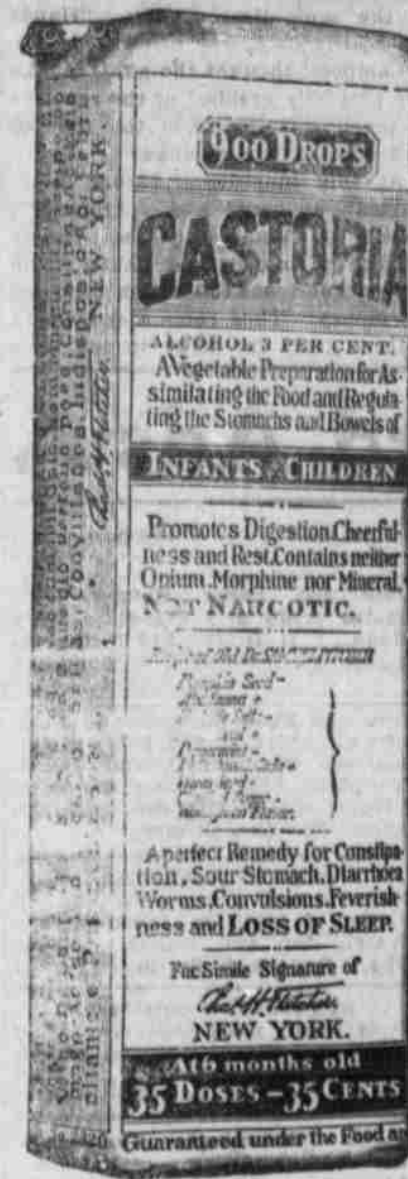
