These delegates are: W. L. Cob, J. H. Booth, T. R. Sheridan, O. P. Coshaw, A. N. Orcutt, Ed Andrews, Roy McClallen, G. V. Wimberly, Jos. McNeill, N. Rice and Geo. Neuner Jr.

While this congress will discuss several matters of interest to the two states concerned, the feature of prime importance will be the best plans for furthering the early construction of the Coos Bay to Boise railroad. The Roseburg delegation will co-operate with the Coos Bay people in the development of this important project and assure them that Roseburg and Douglas county will give every possible assistance for its early consummation.

Development of the boundless natural resources of this portion of Oregon is seriously retarded by lack of a direct means of transportation between the interior and the coast and the building of a railroad is the
