TALENTED SINGER TO VISIT SALEM

Miss Mary Adele Case, Who is Soon to Tour England, to Delight Salem Music Lovers.

No doubt the announcement that Mary Adele Case, the Oregon contralto, will appear in Salem, will be received with great enthusiasm. Miss Case gave a recital recently in Portland which was a pronounced success, and has been persuaded by a number of friends and musically-interested people to come to Salem. Miss Case is home resting after a most successful season throughout the British Isles with Mr. Harold Bauer, the world-renowned pianist. It is interesting to know that this talented young artist is an Oregon girl, who has made her way in the great musical world by hard work and a firm determination to succeed. Two years ago she went to Paris to study with Mr. Frank King Clark, one of the world's most successful maestros, and has reached a place with the great artists of the world in this almost incredible short time that would be considered phenomenal after years and years of study. She possesses a rich mellow contralto voice, a charming stage presence and a finish in all she does that the critics have pronounced most remarkable.

Next season Miss Case will tour England with Mr. Fritz Kreisler, the great violinist. This shows beyond any question of a doubt that she merits what has been said of her, for Kreisler is today one of the greatest artists before the public.

Miss Case expects eventually to go into grand opera. When Mme. Gadsby heard he rising this season she told her she considered her voice one of the most beautiful contraltos she had ever heard and that she knew before long Case would be a name known in grand opera. The program to be given in Salem will be one to interest the public generally as well as the musically interested, and as long as this recital is given out of the regular season the seats will be put on lower than would be otherwise. WANTS TO BECOME A CITIZEN

San Francisco, Aug. 14.—Fearing confiscation of her coffee plantation valued at \$200,000 by the government of Guatemala in retaliation for political acts of some of her male relatives, Miss Marie Perulana, aged ship papers here. She is the first woman to have made an application for admission to citizenship since the formation of the federal courts in this district.

Miss Perulana is a native of Elhusband.

Progreso, San Marcos, Guatemala, and while awaiting the outcome of her petition to the federal court is living on Beulah street, San Francisco.

She is highly educated and speaks three languages. The plantation is owned jointly by herself, a younger sister and a brother, and is situated about El Progreso.

Miss Perulana claimed today that certain officials of her native land are menacing her property and to save her lands she desires to become a citizen of the United States as the Guatemalans then would not dare to confiscate her holdings.

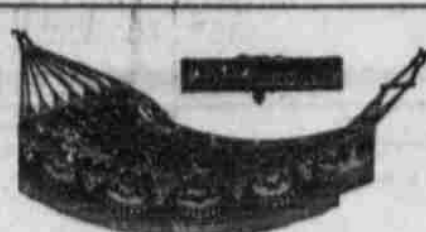
