ALPHONSO'S TROUBLES INCREASE

Canary Islanders About to Revolt and Spanish Troops Meeting With Reverses.

[United Press Landed Wire.] Madrid (via Hendya), Aug. 19.—King Alfonso's troubles are on the increase.

Word was received today that the Canary Islanders are about to revolt and former war minister, Martiategui, has been sent to suppress the movement.

The government today started to reinforce all garrisons throughout Spain. The re-establishment today of the censorship of all war news is interpreted as meaning that the government troops are meeting with heavy reverses in Morocco.

Practically nothing has been given out concerning General Marina's expedition against the Riff tribesmen.

SPLENDID CONCERT MONDAY

Mary Adele Case, Oregon's Greatest Songstress, to Appear Here Before Going East.

The seats for the Mary Adele Case concert will not go on general sale until next Monday, but the ladies who have charge of the concert have been selling the house by subscription and have met with decided success, and from the present indications the Oregon concert will sing to a large audience. This concert will be one of the greatest musical treats Salem has ever had. Within the last few days Miss Case has had an offer to go into opera with the Savage forces, but she does not intend doing so for the present, as she expects to return to Germany next season and coach for grand opera. In the meantime she will appear in concert in the east, after making a short tour through California.

Miss Case is unquestionably one of the most successful concert artists before the public today. Her success through England and Scotland was phenomenal. So often we hear prima donnas out here who have long since lost their youth and freshness, but such is not the case with Miss Case, as she is quite young and throws all the enthusiasm of youth into her work. The splendid training this artist has had with Clark of Paris is most noticeable in her perfect handling of her remarkably beautiful voice. Miss Case never tries to do anything she is not perfectly sure of and her interpretations are delightful because she sings with such ease, sureness and finish.

This young Oregon girl surely deserves a great deal of credit for working her own way in the world of music. When Mr. Barnabee of the old Bostonians heard her several years before she had studied abroad he told her he knew she would succeed if she was willing to endure all the hardships that one must meet with before one is able to take a big place in the world of music, and when he was told this clever young girl was then working and studying day and night so as to be able to go abroad to complete her musical education, he said: "Well, then nothing can keep her from success. With that remarkable voice and that ambition, coupled with the fact she was not afraid of hardships." And it is her perseverance as much as anything that has put her in the front rank of musical artists today. One seldom hears so big a voice as Miss Case's in one so young or such finish in the interpretations.

WARMEST DAY OF THE SUMMER

According to the local weather bureau report, which is officially recorded at the O. C. T. Company's wharf in this city, Salem has had, as usual, a very agreeable summer so far as climatic conditions are concerned. Yesterday, August 18, was the warmest day of the year to date, the report showing the mercury to have climbed up to 90 degrees, but it stayed at this point but a short time and the minimum temperature was 58 degrees this morning.

In 1908 on August 18, the report shows the warmest day to be 93 degrees, or three degrees warmer than it was yesterday. The minimum temperature was 64 degrees or exceeding that of yesterday and last night eight degrees.

To enable our eastern brothers to more thoroughly appreciate our Oregon climate the following weather table has been arranged, showing the maximum and minimum temperatures for the past seven days for 1909 and the same days in 1908:
