PATHETIC DROWNING AT EUGENE

Rena Ireland Meets Death in Rapids of the McKenzie River Last Sunday Morning.

The Register of Eugene has the following account of the drowning of Rena Ireland Monday last: The treacherous waters of the McKenzie have claimed another victim, and Miss Rena Ireland, aged 19 years, now lies cold in death at the home of George Ward, near Thurston, as the result of a boating accident at Craig rapids on Sunday afternoon.

As will be remembered by Register readers, B. F. Finn, 84 years of age, and the grandfather of the deceased, had built a large 22-foot logging boat, which he was under contract to deliver to the Spaulding brothers at Salem and had planned to take Mr. and Mrs. Albert Ward and Mrs. Ward's two daughters, Rena and Mabel Ireland, to Salem with them and go from thence by steamboat to Portland and on to the fair at Seattle on a pleasure trip. Norbert Aya of Eugene had been invited to come to Ward's and accompany the party as far as Hayden's bridge and do what fishing he wanted while on the way.

They started out joyfully Sunday morning with all their effects in the boat and ran all the rapids and riffles safely until they came to the Craig rapids above Thurston. Mr. Finn was at the oars and was rowing head on in smooth water when he took out his tobacco and was preparing to cut off a chew with his knife when his granddaughter, Rena, who sat next behind him, told him to take the oars quickly and turn the boat around, as they were approaching rough water. He did so at once, but not quickly enough, for the boat caught by the current, was borne rapidly toward a jam of logs, one of which hung over the surface only a few inches above the water, which swept down under it with terrific force. He yelled at Ward and Aya to push the boat off from the logs with their fishing poles, and they attempted to do so, when their weight on the side of the boat caused it to dip toward the log and in an instant it was overturned.

Mabel Ireland, the 7-year-old daughter of Mrs. Ward, soon appeared on the surface and Mr. Finn grabbed her by the hair and dragged her to the boat and he had scarcely got her safe when Mrs. Ward came to the surface (both having been under the boat), and he quickly caught hold of her hair and pulled her on the boat also after almost superhuman effort. Meanwhile he looked for Rena, but saw her only once after she jumped overboard, and she had probably gone on down the river.

Ward and Aya both escaped as by a miracle, as neither were very good swimmers and had it not been that the latter got hold of an oar he certainly would have drowned. After Ward got out he came up along the bank and although almost exhausted he waded out as far as he could and Mr. Finn helped Mabel on his back and he carried her out to the shore. He came back after his wife, but as he drew near the boat he was so nearly exhausted that he said he could not take her back and being just ready to sink down, Mr. Finn helped him on to the bottom of the boat, where all three held on very insecurely. After much crying for help Mr. Aya appeared on the scene and Mr. Finn sent him for help and after a half hour Mr. Craig came with a long rope and by some most careful work succeeded in getting them all ashore and the boat also.

Begin Search for Body. In the meantime Mr. Aya and the crew had aroused the neighborhood by phone and it was not long until a large crowd of neighbors had assembled and a systematic

search was made for Miss Rena's body. It was found about three hours after the accident about a quarter of a mile down the stream and was rescued by four men taking hold of each other's hands, the last man diving down after the body and bringing it to the surface.
