## THE PORTLAND FAIR AND LIVESTOCK EXPOSITION

The primary object in organizing the Portland Fair and Livestock Exposition was to foster and advance the livestock interests of Oregon and also of the Northwest. With this object in view the business men of Oregon got together and formed such an organization. Among the promoters are Portland's and Oregon's prominent bankers, wholesale and retail merchants. Through their untiring efforts Portland has one of the best equipped fair plants on the Pacific coast; \$200,000 were spent in securing this plant and today it is the talk of the Pacific coast.

The race track is a regulation mile track, laid out and built on the best plans obtainable. It is considered the fastest track on the coast and this was demonstrated last year when Ray O'Light paced to the coast's three-year-old record of 2:08 3/4.

The grandstand is situated on the north side of the grounds and from it one of the finest panoramic views in Oregon may be seen. Almost every part of the entire grounds is visible from the grandstand and an unequalled view of the races may be seen from it.

Barns for horses, cattle, sheep and swine have been built and each is arranged for its special purpose. The barns are large and roomy and present a nice appearance and exhibitors who were at the fair last year speak very highly of the accommodations.

The business men and citizens of Portland feel justly proud of the \$290,000 plant and all Oregon should turn out and support this fair, which will be held September 20-25, and a banner crowd is expected.

## WIRE WIZARD COMING.

**Robildello, King of Gymnasts, Making First American Tour.**

Robildello, the king of all wire-walkers, a veritable wizard, will soon make his appearance in Salem, he being one of the features with Ringling Brothers' circus, which is dated to exhibit here on Thursday, August 26. Robildello is not to be contrasted with an other wire walker, for there is not another on earth who can even imitate his simplest trick.

Robildello was the most talked of actor in Europe last winter. He toured through Germany, France and England at the highest salary that up to that time had ever been paid to a single performer, and he is worth every cent of it. He dances and stands on his head upon a slender wire, and mimics the antics of a tipsy man coming home in the early hours of morning, even to the extent of falling down, yet not once losing his balance. The wire is high above the ground and there is no net beneath it.

Another of the sensational acts is presented by the Lorch family of acrobats, the equal of which is not to be found. These talented Europeans use donkeys and ponies in their act. It is a novelty and quite thrilling.

The Arthur Saxon trio of strong men, who make a combined lift of more than four tons; the Schumann performing horses, which drink from glasses and roll each other around in huge beer barrels; the telephoning elephants and the death-defying double-somersaulting automobile act are a few more of the sensational things to be seen under the tents of Ringling Brothers' circus.

When the show opened at Madison Square Garden in March, the people of New York went wild over the magnificence of the big circus and its elaborate program of European sensations and novelties. It was the best circus engagement ever held in that city and the papers were not slow in saying so. There has

not been a change in the bill since that opening. The performances here will be identical.
