## MAY SUE CITY FOR DAMAGES

Damage Suit May Cause Enforcing of Speed Laws. Husband Thinks City Negligent.

Seattle, Aug. 21.—The body of Mrs. Elizabeth Alene Colvin, one of the victims of yesterday's automobile disaster in which five persons lost their lives by being hurled through a bridge into the bay, has been recovered, making four bodies brought from the water. The corpse of Mrs. Colvin was found about 20 feet from the wrecked automobile by men who had been working for many hours with grappling hooks. John Colvin, husband of the dead woman, said today that while he had hardly decided what course he would pursue, he expected to consult a solicitor upon his return to Vancouver and that in all probability he will file a suit for damages against the city. His action, he said, would be determined by the finding of the coroner, who will hold an inquest this afternoon. It is claimed by officials of the street department that a red lantern has been burning nightly at the dangerous curve on the bridge to warn vehicles to slow down at that point, but after the accident no trace of this light could be found and it is declared by relatives and friends of the victims of the accident that the city has been negligent in not providing adequate safeguards at the place known as "Deadman's Curve."

## BODIES NO DOUBT LOST IN DEEP CREVASSE

Seattle, Aug. 21.—Determined that the search for his brother, T. Y. Callaghan, and J. W. Stevens, who are lost somewhere in the fastnesses of Mount Rainier, shall not be abandoned until every resource at his command has been exhausted, O. Callaghan of Portland is in Seattle today arranging another expedition on a larger scale than any yet attempted. He visited the home of Sydney Sherman in West Seattle, where the missing brother resided up to the time of his departure for the mountain trip and consulted his family concerning the missing man's preparations for the journey. He also called on Louis M. Sterling, a clerk in the customs service, who conversed with the Callaghan party a week ago yesterday as they stood between Gibraltar and the summit of the mountain in the face of a blinding snowstorm. Halted at the brink of a 500-foot ice cliff, whither they had traced footprints, after toiling 15 hours along the trail left by the missing men, the party of guides headed by Joe Stampfer, believe now that the bodies of Callaghan and Stevens rest far beyond human recovery in a crevasse in perpetual ice at the head of White River glacier. The ice above the cliff is so steep that the searching party dared not attempt to descend.

## UNION PACIFIC WILL RUN CARS TO SEATTLE

Seattle, Aug. 21.—The Union Pacific is coming to Seattle just as soon as we can get here. We want to begin our service early in September, but after so many vexatious delays, I would prefer to give no definite date," said J. D. Farrell, president of the Harriman lines in Washington, today. In speaking of the report that the Union Pacific had abandoned its purpose to run through trains to the sound. Mr. Farrell said he was at a loss to account for such a report. "The papers for the purchase of an interest in the right of way from Portland and the use of the Northern Pacific tracks immediately have been signed in New York and are now in the mails," said Mr. Farrell.

President Elliott of the Northern Pacific, who is here, also declared he knew of no reason why the Union Pacific would not run trains here, inasmuch as that line had an interest in the right of way.

## RANCHER OFFERS PURSE OF \$75,000

[United Press Leased Wire.] New York, Aug. 21.—Joseph C. Miller, the millionaire ranchman, wants James J. Jeffries and Jack Johnson to battle for the world's heavyweight championship on his ranch, near Bliss, Oklahoma.

With this idea in view, Miller, who owns the famous 101 ranch of a hundred thousand acres, today offers a purse of \$75,000 for the mill, to come off the second week in April, and offers to post a \$25,000 deposit as a guarantee of good faith in any bank that the fighters may name.

With his hundred thousand acres Miller expresses the opinion that he can accommodate all of the sports who may want to see the fight.

If this offer looks good to the fighters, Miller says that he will post the balance of the \$75,000 the minute the details of the fight articles are signed. Miller's offer is believed here to have been made in good faith and few fight authorities doubt that he will post the money, if the fighters say the word.

## APPROPRIATE \$20,000 TO ENTERTAIN TAFT

[United Press Leased Wire.] Juarez, Mex., Aug. 21.—An appropriation of \$20,000 was voted here by the city authorities for the entertainment of President Taft when he visits this city in October after meeting President Diaz at El Paso, Texas.

Preparations are already being made to greet the heads of the two governments on October 16 and the town will be decorated with the national colors of Mexico and the United States.

A bull fight will be held while Taft is in the city.

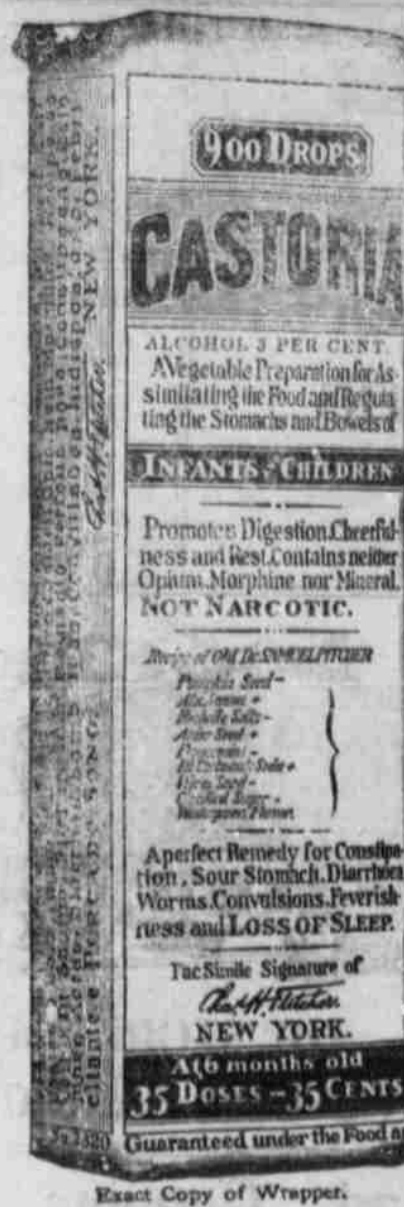
