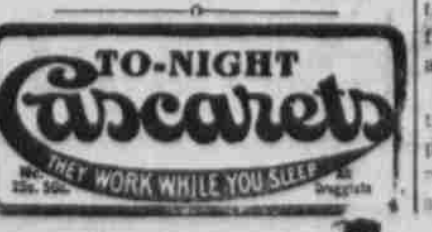

Heroine of Double Somersault Auto to Be Seen Here.
