McLaughlin Bros. of Columbus, Ohio, will show a large number of heavy horses. They are well known exhibitors and have won at any show of consequence.

J. Crouch & Son of Lafayette, Ind., has been importing horses for years and are well known at every show and fair of importance. They have a branch barn at Portland and Sacramento, and will have a big exhibit.

Children Cry FOR FLETCHER'S CASTORIA

RAISING MONGOLIAN PHEASANTS

R. F. Simpson of Lebanon Has Brood of More Than 200 and Also Much Experience.

R. F. Simpson, on Grant street, this city, is engaged in the breeding and raising of Mongolian pheasants for sale.

These birds are much sought after by states where they are unknown as a game bird, and on account of this quite a demand for them has developed. In fact, the breeding and raising of this fowl has become quite an industry by a few persons in the Willamette valley, who have done a thriving business in this line.

Mr. Simpson only embarked in this industry last spring. A person unacquainted with the increase of this feathered family would say that Mr. Simpson had met with fairly good success for an amateur, but the gentleman declares he has learned some tricks which will materially aid him in the future.

To commence with last April Mr. Simpson had 21 hens and five roosters. At this time he has something over 200 young ones, ranging in size from three days' old to half-grown birds, and the hens are still laying.

One expensive lesson Mr. Simpson has learned. He had something over 100 eggs under hens, when he discovered that chicken lice were annoying the setting hens, causing them to become uneasy and restless on the nests. In order to allay this annoyance he rubbed the feet and wings of the setting fowl with coal oil. The vermin disappeared, but the oil had the effect of killing the birds in the eggs, and out of the 100 and more not a single bird was hatched. More than 100 additional eggs were destroyed through different causes.

White bantam hens are used for hatching purposes, they having been found to be more careful and painstaking with the young than any other of the feathered tribe tried by this breeder of pheasants.

Experience has taught that hens of larger breed are apt to become restless and move about on the nest more than the bantam, thus causing the death of many of the young immediately after leaving the shell.

Mr. Simpson is raising two kinds of pheasants—the ring neck and the golden, the latter being from the northern part of China.

Of the golden he had but one pair to start with, and now he has an even dozen of the young. The male of this breed is one of the most beautiful birds extant, having all the colors of the rainbow in his plumage. The one Mr. Simpson exhibits is now at about his best, although it is claimed he will show to slightly better advantage a little later on.

The golden pheasant is said to be much harder and easier to raise than the ring neck. This would not seem to be the case to the person unfamiliar with the birds, as the latter look to be much harder of the two feathered tribes.

It is said that ring necks require constant care and attention, especially as to the food given them, they appearing somewhat esthetic on this point.—Lebanon Express.
