CALIFORNIA'S COPPER PRODUCT

[United Press Local Wire.] San Francisco, Aug. 28.—State Mineralogist Anshin in his advance statistical report on the mineral wealth of the state, given out today, states that California's copper production for the year was 49,867,872 pounds and its value was \$7,000,000 approximately.

This is the greatest amount of copper yet produced within the state for one year. Most of the copper was mined in Shasta county, where 34,878,677 pounds were taken from the earth.
