The leading lady, Carrie Webber, as "Louie Sedaine," did some excellent work, and some that can be better described by the word "bum" than any other. Her work was as spotted as a cayuse—the balance of the female cast was not particularly strong. Dwight Allen, as "Col. Andrew Tandy," and William Sellery, as "Professor Aubrey Maboon," did some excellent work, and to them is largely due the success of the production, for it was a success. John P. Clark, as "Richard O'Shaughnessy," the leading man, was a fit companion, as far as work went, for the leading lady. The play itself is spotted. [United Press Leased Wire.] Rock Springs, Wyo., Aug. 31.—When the body of John Starman, more than six feet tall, who died at Hudson, Wyo., reached here today it was found that, in order to ship it in a casket too short, the legs had been severed at the knees. Indignant relatives and friends say they will prosecute the Hudson undertaker.

An order from the undertaker that the coffin should not be opened under any circumstances aroused the suspicion of Starman's friends, and an investigation revealed the legless body.

The excuse of the undertaker is that the remains were not in a condition to keep, and, unable to embalm them and secure a larger casket, he severed the legs believing no one would be the wiser.

TELEPHONE ORDINANCE DEFEATED

After Hard Fight Made by Republican City Committeeman West.

[United Press Leased Wire.] Lewiston, Idaho, Aug. 31.—A movement to petition the government to improve the channel of the Snake river five miles west of Riparia is being started here.

The action is the result of failure on the part of the local river navigation company to operate its boats between Lewiston and Celilo owing to low water in the river channel. The failure of the line to run vessels at this time has caused heavy loss to ranchers who have grain ready to move but cannot secure transportation facilities.
