Chet Bowen, Salem's twirler, was in bad repute with the lucky streak all the time. The Portland players had him on their list from the start, and after hitting him up to the tune of four runs in the first three innings, Salem put in their new man. Great things were expected from the new twirler by both the Salem players and the fans, but things did not materialize as expected, and after two innings had been pitched and two hits, with a ball over the fence, Manager Jerman stepped in. Jerman laid the ball over in fine style, and, although the visitors touched him up considerably, they could not knock the ball out of the hands of Salem's infield. Two high fliers were hit, but fielders soon destroyed them. Only one run was made off Jerman, and this one was due to some slack playing behind him. Salem was working the Albina southpaw for everything that he managed to put up. Every man up would get a crack at the ball, and had the game extended over a few more innings the score would either have been tied or beaten.

The Portlanders smashed some hard ones down to Hunt on third, Johnson on short and Humphreys on second, but these players put the would-be hits on the shelf. Johnson made a surprisingly long run after a line drive at one time and pulled it down out of the air, thus saving a clean hit, and Humphreys stabbed a grass-cutter which was just about to bound merrily into the outfield over second base. The local team, in all, played a fast and interesting game, and the crowd gave them credit. The Portland team also is deserving of praise for their playing, and they made their word good by bringing to Salem a very fast bunch of ball players.
