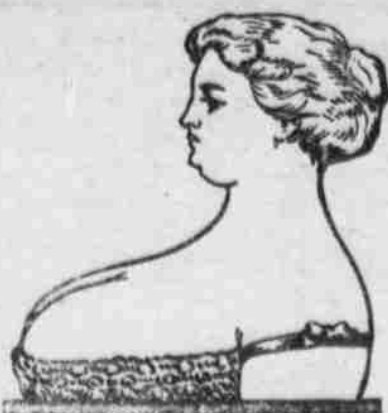

WILL ENTERTAIN THE SPANISH WAR VETERANS

(United Press Leased Wire.) Tacoma, Sept. 1.—Arrangements are now practically complete for the entertainment of the United States Spanish American war veterans when they assemble here next week to hold their national convention. The meeting opens one week from today, but special trains bearing the delegates will begin arriving here early next week. The sessions will last three days. For two days prior to the national convention the state convention will be in session at Bremerton. The coming convention will be the first ever held on the Pacific coast by the Spanish war veterans and for this reason it is believed that the attendance will be exceptionally large. There are 574 camps of the veterans scattered throughout the United States.

WANTS SALVE FOR BOY'S REPUTATION

(United Press Leased Wire.) Spokane, Wash., Sept. 1.—Damaged to the extent of \$25,000 by the ridicule, disgrace and humiliation following his imprisonment and arrest, "maliciously and without cause, or any cause," is the claim of Nelson E. Pratt, a 12-year-old boy, who by his father, Emmett E. Pratt, as guardian, has sued the Great Northern Railroad Company to recover. The records of the juvenile court show that the boy was one of five youngsters who were accused of placing a tie on the Great Northern tracks for the apparent purpose of wrecking the Oriental Limited train. After a hearing sentence was suspended pending the future good behavior of the boys.

MAY PROSECUTE GOVERNOR GENERAL

(United Press Leased Wire.) Victoria, B. C., Sept. 1.—Members of the Victoria Gun club are today conducting an investigation of the report that Earl Grey and Lord Lascelles, who have been spending some days on a hunting trip on Vancouver Island, killed a mountain goat and two deer in the northern woods. If the report is proven correct, the attorney general will be asked to prosecute the governor general of Canada and his aide-de-camp as the open season for deer does not commence until October.

COMPANIES ARE ACCUSED OF CRIME

(United Press Leased Wire.) Toronto, Ont., Sept. 1.—Six local fire insurance companies, charged with conspiracy in maintaining a certain standard of rates in Rochester, will be arraigned in the September term of court.

The alleged monopolists today declared that they will fight the cases to a finish, and preparations to contest in the appellate court has been begun by the attorneys.
