LEBANON RESIDENCE BURNED

Clyde Morrison Badly Burned, But Not Dangerously So. House and Contents Total Loss.

A fire at 3:30 o'clock last Sunday morning caused the entire destruction of the house and contents at the southwest corner of Williams and Rose streets, occupied by Clyde Morrison, wife and baby, the occupants barely escaping with their lives.

The fire was caused by the explosion of an alcohol stove which was used in heating milk for the infant. Mr. Morrison had arisen shortly before the hour mentioned and lighted the stove.

Mr. Morrison was completely enveloped in the flames. Wearing only his night clothes he fell an easy prey to the fire, and in a remarkably short time was severely burned from his knees to and including his face.

At first it was feared Mr. Morrison might have inhaled the flame, but an examination later developed the fact that this was not the case. It is not believed he will be scarred to any perceptible extent.

Mrs. Morrison had her hands severely burned in attempting to extinguish the flames of the night gown of her husband. Other than the hands Mrs. Morrison was not burned.

In escaping from the house the occupants practically walked through fire. The baby escaped without any injury whatever, which was most providential.

An alarm of fire was sounded and the fire department and many citizens responded, but were powerless to save either the house or contents, the fire having gained such headway. Within a few minutes all that was left of the residence was a heap of ashes and a few charred timbers.

The house was owned by Joseph Butler. It was valued at \$1000 and was insured for \$550 in the Oregon Fire Relief Association. No insurance was carried on the contents.—Lebanon Express.
