## LEBANON TO HAVE FINE SCHOOL HOUSE

The contract for building the new school building at Lebanon has been let to John McChesney, of Albany, for \$26,310, says the Lebanon Express. The other bids submitted were all from Portland contractors, and were as follows: A. J. F. Bowman, \$27,800; Edward Killfeather & Co., \$30,497; Palmer & Ellison, \$35,561; D. Madonna & Co., \$35,600. The work of excavating for the foundation will be commenced in a few days.

The building will be an imposing one, and will occupy a site 72x118 feet. It is to be of brick, faced with fine pressed brick. The structure will be two stories high and will contain 14 class and recitation rooms, as well as an assembly hall, to occupy 45x95 feet. In addition to these quarters a library, a teachers' room and an office for the principal will be provided. The building will be modern throughout.—Albany Herald.
