MYSTERY OF HIS LIFE UNSOLVED

San Diego, Cal., Sept. 6.—All that is mortal of John Streube, priest, soldier and savant, who died here Friday at the age of 90 years, were taken far out to sea early yesterday in a blossom decked tug and consigned to the broad Pacific, in accordance with the last wish he expressed before he died. For twenty years Streube lived a mysterious life in this city. Though known as John Streube to his few acquaintances, it was generally supposed that he was an Alsatian of noble descent. This latter supposition was borne out by the discovery in his effects of letters written under a ducal crest and addressed to "My Son." With these letters, which were yellowed with age, were others supposed to have been written by Streube, signed "John, the Unfortunate."

According to facts Streube confided to his friends, he came to the United States in 1852 as an exile, and despite his early training for the priesthood, served with the Union army throughout the Civil war. He once occupied the chair of philosophy in a Jesuit college, where he was known as Frater Johannes Francis-Xavier de Streube.

Pittsburg, Sept. 4.—Railroad officials and detectives today are investigating the wreck of the "Royal Blue Limited" last night at Chewton, Pa., in which five persons were killed, and more than 30 injured.
