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POUNDMASTER THREATENS TO KILL BOB

Street Car Dog is Liable to the Municipal License Tax on All the Canines.

Poundmaster Long has notified the street car employees that they will have to pay the annual \$3 license tax for dogs or the Salem street car watch dog "Bob" will pay for the penalty with his life. There was great excitement caused among the force on Salem's traction line because Bob is dear to the hearts of all the boys. Traction Superintendent Zinn told the city tax collector that he would not pay the tax, as Bob, the watch dog, rendered the city a great service and was really as good as a policeman to keep dogs off the tracks and prevent accidents. Bob wears a badge and has regular rations issued to him at the car barn, where he sleeps. Bob is on the street from the time the first cars go out until the last car is in at night. He stays at the intersection of State and Commercial streets. If a car gets into trouble anywhere out on the line Bob starts to find what the trouble is. Glidden of Boston will in the near future attempt to ascertain whether a deaf and dumb and blind person is better fitted to pilot a balloon than a person endowed with all the normal senses.

Miss Keller already has conquered all the obstacles presented by the lack of sight, hearing and speech and the sensations that she experiences while drifting among the clouds will settle to a great extent the question as to the effect of aeronautics upon the physiology and physical nature of man. This remarkable young woman has long been interested in the efforts of the Wrights and other aviators to conquer the air and she hails with delight the opportunity of making the flight with Glidden.

Harbor until Wednesday, and whether the charges will be given out from there, he says, rests with General Hubbard. Commander Peary today said:

"The Roosevelt sailed from Eagle Island for New York last night. When the vessel passes Sanday Hook I shall be on the bridge and when it docks I will tell the people that the man who found the north pole is standing on the bridge of the Roosevelt."

Commander Peary refused to discuss the charges made by Whitney in his cable message to Dr. Cook, that Peary would not allow Whitney to take Dr. Cook's belongings on board the steamer Roosevelt, and forced him to leave them cached at Etah.

In answer to several questions on the subject all Peary would say was that the charges made by Whitney would not help Cook.

Peary also refused to discuss the assertion that Whitney left the Roosevelt only because he was forced to do so. In concluding the interview, Peary said:

"I have only this to say; Dr. Cook did not reach the pole. I am prepared to leave the verdict to the world. When I have finished with Cook, I will prove, as I said before, that Cook did not reach the pole."

MILITIA TO MONKEY WITH A BALLOON

The maneuvers will be a part of the program of the eleventh annual convention of the National Guard association, which is in session in this city.

Captain H. W. Slotterbeck of Company A, assisted by two privates, will be in charge of the war balloon, and an attempt will be made to sail to Whittier, 22 miles southeast of this city.

MURDERED FATHER; ABDUCTED DAUGHTER

The crime was committed last night near Janning, and the news was brought to this city today. Billy Boy had long been an admirer of the Indian girl, and Boniface is said to have forbidden him to see her again.

Billy is armed with a rifle, which he stole from the house of Arthur Gilman, of Banning, and is expected to put up a stubborn resistance if he is surrounded.

JAPS SMUGGLE OPIUM INTO THE ISLANDS
