

SUPREME COURT OPINIONS

In an opinion handed down by the supreme court today, written by Chief Justice Moore, the Krebs Hop Company was given judgment against the T. A. Lively Hop Company in the sum of \$6000 and costs.

Other opinions handed down by the supreme court today are State against Harry Daly, the convicted murderer. The supreme court denied a petition for re-hearing, the opinion being written by Chief Justice Moore.

Justice Kling dissented, sustaining the lower court's verdict in the case on the grounds that the plea of insanity introduced by Daly's counsel was not thoroughly considered. Justice Kling is of the opinion that the trial court did not fully appraise every phase of the law governing insanity, whereby the defendant was deprived of his constitutional rights.

Abraham L. Kesler, et al., against Chas. W. Nee, et al., appealed from the circuit court of Washington coun-

ty, J. U. Campbell, judge; case dismissed in an opinion written by Justice Slater.
