NO TRACE OF MEYERS YET FOUND

Sheriff and His Posse Follow Clews But They All Lead to Nothing—Question of Time Only.

Sheriff Minto and his men, James Culver and Constable Ira Hamilton, are still keeping up a stubborn search for George Meyers in the vicinity of Silver Creek Falls, the place at which he was last seen. Reports continue to arrive concerning the fugitive, and last night many wild rumors were circulated, some to the effect that Meyers had been caught, and others that he was dead, but the last news heard of him was that he was seen hurrying through the timber a mile northwest of the falls.

All day yesterday the three men hunters scoured the surrounding country near the falls. They made the tedious and tiresome trip through the mountains to Meyers' claim, 12 miles due east of Silver Creek falls, but found no trace of the owner. When Meyers was seen near the falls late yesterday afternoon, a messenger was dispatched after the officers, who returned to the place, but, owing to darkness coming on, they could not work with much success.

George Meyers is thought by the authorities to be nearing the end of his liberty. The thickly populated district south of Stayton lies but a few miles north of Silver Creek falls, and should George Meyers direct his course that way his chances of escape will be small. There remains not the

slightest doubt in the minds of the authorities today but that Meyers will fight hard before captured. He has probably heard of the result of the work done by his gun on Tom Eckhart, and will be desperate.

At 3 o'clock this morning another posse of armed men joined in the hunt for Meyers. They were Chief of Police Gibson, Will Hayden, Emory Jamieson and Walter Johnson. The party left in a big auto, but where they will take up the hunt is not known to anyone but themselves.

The Salem public is extremely anxious concerning the outcome of the hunt. The telephone at the sheriff's office is ringing day and night, and Deputy Sheriff Esch has a hard time attending to the duties of his office and answering calls.

Up to the time The Journal went to press, no information was received from the searching party, with the exception of a brief telephone message from Sheriff Minto, to the effect that no further trace of Meyers could be found. The sheriff was at Sublimity when he phoned.
