THE SAME OLD STORY OF YIELDING

Charley Hoedle, formerly one of the most respected and well liked men in Marion county, was indicted by the grand jury yesterday afternoon for the crime of embezzlement of several hundred dollars of the county school funds.

This case is peculiarly sad. Mr. Hoedle has long been a resident of this county, and is very well liked by all his associates. He was intrusted with school funds while filling the position of school clerk, but circumstances combined against him, and financial difficulties became too

pressing. Mr. Hoedle appropriated sum after sum, with the honest intention of replacing the money as soon as possible. After he had gone far deeper than he expected to go he found that he could not return the money, and went to California, when his regretful plight was discovered, and a warrant was issued for his arrest. He made brave attempts to get possession of enough money with which to pay the debt, but his efforts were useless, and he returned to Oregon. While in St. Louis the officers arrested and brought him to Salem to answer the charge.

He ordered that the balloon be inflated immediately, declaring that he "guessed that he would ride right home." The manufacturer had some difficulty in explaining that it would take a few days to hunt leaks in the gas bag, and to make full preparations for the journey.

Pruden waited until last night, then, with two friends, he ascended and started southward. He is 60 years old, and never made an ascent before.
