LOTS OF HOT AIR OVER A DIRTY PIUTE

Looks Like Officers Were Playing to Get Into the Lime-light Over Indian Murderer.

San Bernardino, Cal., Oct. 11.—Word reached this city today from the Chemhucis Indian reservation, in Southern Nevada, that Long Boy, cousin of the Piute desperado Billy Boy, has started into the desert in the direction of The Pipes country, where the murderer has built his granite stronghold.

Long Boy is said to be armed and well supplied, and it is thought that he intends to join his fugitive kinsman.

Should Long Boy succeed in meeting Billy and joining forces with him, the task of the posse that will start again on the trail will be made doubly dangerous. Long Boy also is said to be a crack marksman, and with the ammunition and provisions he is reported to be carrying, the hunted Indian will be able to stand a long siege.

A wagon load of supplies for the posse that will start today or tomorrow to resume the man hunt was delivered early today at Warren's Wells. Other supply bases will be established today at Old Woman Springs and Twenty-Nine Palms, both within a few hours ride of Bullion Mountain, where Billy's lair is located. Three posses are searching today. The posse from this city will ride under the leadership of Sheriff Ralphs and Deputy Sheriff Hewins.

Deputy Ben DeCrevencour, of Banning, is gathering a detachment of man hunters in that village, and Sheriff Wilson, of Riverside, today wired Ralphs that he would join him near Twenty-Nine Palms with a dozen officers.

Sheriff Ralphs' posse has been delayed in starting because of the inability of the men to secure horses. Livery stable owners in this city and ranchers in the outlying districts have refused to provide horses for the trip. The object lesson given when Billy dropped four horses belonging to the first posse with his Winchester, apparently has proved sufficient to scare owners of horseflesh.

Miners and settlers in the Colorado desert section are becoming alarmed at the officers' failure to capture the desperado, and are leaving their camps and flocking to the desert stations. Bear Valley stock men are in constant dread of a night attack by the murderer in his foraging for provisions, and range riders refuse to penetrate the Bullion mountain region.

Ralphs stated today that the posse now organizing will bring the Indian to this city dead or alive.

"We will stay in the desert until we get him," he declared, "if it takes a year. We now have sufficient provisions and ammunition, and I have arranged for supplies to be taken to certain desert stations every three days while we are out. The fellow's days are numbered."
