

MAIL SERVICE ON WEST SALEM RAILROAD

Great Need for Mail Connection via Oregon Electric and Falls City & Western and Distribution from Salem.

The Salem Board of Trade should take up the matter of getting mails carried between this city and Dallas and Falls City. If mail went by the

Oregon Electric 6:30 a. m. train from Portland to Salem, instead of by the Yamhill division, it would be a great gain for West Salem, Dallas, Falls City and all intermediate points.

This would make Salem a distributing point and the center of things in the way of mail distribution for the valley. The Salem postoffice should co-operate in securing this faster service. Some transfer company should handle baggage and express and mail between the Oregon Electric and West Salem and between West Salem and this city.

Mail to Falls City.

J. J. Fidler, proprietor of the Dallas-Salem stage line, informs the Dallas Observer that his mail contract with the government will not expire until next July, but that he hopes it will soon be arranged for the railroad company to release him from the duty. Since the opening of the new train service between Dallas and Salem, Mr. Fidler has been carrying the mail in a buggy, but this is unprofitable to him, the principal revenue of the old stage line having been derived from the carrying of freight and passengers.

Mr. Fidler says that Dallas' already excellent mail service will be greatly improved as soon as the contract is turned over to the railroad company. It will not only be possible then to get the Portland morning papers at 9:40 o'clock, but the California mail will read Dallas nearly 18 hours earlier than at present. The major portion of the mail is carried on the train that arrives in Salem at 3:15, and, instead of being carried through to Portland, to be transferred to the morning train at Jefferson street, it will be brought directly across to Dallas on the afternoon of its arrival in Salem. California mail carried on the train arriving in Salem at 7:43 p. m., if put off there, will reach Salem at 9:40 o'clock the next morning, instead of at 11:15 as at present.

The afternoon train from Salem connects with the northbound Corvallis-Portland train at West Side crossing, near Derry. The new service affords quick and economical communication between all Yamhill and Washington county towns and the state capital.
