BOOSTING GOOD ROADS AT SANDY

Portland Journal Report.

There was a great big, hustling grange picnic dinner gathering at Sandy yesterday afternoon, and Conrad Junker's big dance hall was crowded to its capacity from 1 to 4 p. m. The ladies of Sandy grange served a fine dinner free to the guest, and many Portland people were present to hear the literary program and Hon. Grant B. Dimick and Col. E. Hofer on the issues of the coming political campaign, the first exposition of bombs in the Republican camp taking place here on schedule time.

Sandy is a center of trade for a large district, has fine roads leading in all directions, is on the line of the Mt. Hood railway, and at the top of the fine 40-foot grade that Clackamas county has built up from the canyon of the Sandy on a seven per cent grade. There is much enthusiasm for good roads, and, politically speaking, Judge Dimick's home county will not tolerate any tampering with the direct primary, direct legislation or the direct election of senators.

The leaders of Canby grange express a keen desire to have ambitious Portland politicians to try conclusions with them.

Motor Enthusiasts Attend.

E. B. Riley, of the Portland Automobile club, was at the Sandy grange picnic yesterday with other motor enthusiasts, and said a number of the friends who drive puff wagons were prepared to put \$5000, without strings to it, towards making the county road as far as Rhododendron a model driveway. They wanted the people at Sandy and beyond to contribute in labor as much more, and they were not even particular about that.

Col. Hofer, of Salem, was present, and spoke for a state-wide good roads movement. He advocated state-built highways, and said that the state policy should be to use the convict laborers more than had been done in the past. Many were employed on the state institutions about Salem, and he thought there would not be as many ejections under a well planned state highway scheme as at present.

Convicts, he said, would find it far more difficult to leave the guards out on the highways than in close proximity to trains over the Southern Pacific every few hours. He thought it was far better to have them employed on state highways than in manufacturing stoves in competition with free labor.

Portland Oregonian Report.

Judge Grant B. Dimick delivered an instructive talk on "Taxation," and also spoke of the necessity of good roads. Following Judge Dimick, Colonel E. Hofer, of Salem, addressed the meeting at some length. He dwelt on the necessity for more indirect taxation and less direct.

"Why, you Grangers," declared Colonel Hofer, "helped place a tax on several corporations, and I had the honor of having a measure passed taxing insurance companies. Altogether the state is getting about \$300,000 annually from this sort of taxation, and we want more of the sort. Some states make no direct tax levy, but derive their income from indirect taxation, and that is what we want in Oregon, and what you farmers want."

"We have made some progress in legislation in Oregon, but the Sellwood Republican club, of Portland, and some others want it set aside. They say that the people cannot legislate for themselves, that they have not the ability and discrimination to do so with intelligence. That is unfounded. Compared with the acts of the last legislature the people by their votes showed they were infinitely superior to the men sent to Salem to legislate for them."

"Judge Dimick is a candidate for the nomination for governor, and is entitled to the consideration of the people. Another matter, the supreme court has been attacked, but let me say it is unjust, for these judges are hard-working men, and seldom take a vacation."
