### LOSS OF LIFE

ing to a wireless message from Key West today at least 1000 men employed on the Florida East Coast railroad were drowned in the storm which wrecked a large part of the roadway across the keys. Many of those reported to have perished were living in house boats made fast to the trestle work, or anchored in the shallows surrounding the marshy islands.

Earlier it was reported that the men escaped, but these reports are being contradicted by later advices reaching the main land.

Key West is still under martial law, and a number of looters have been taken into custody by the troops and police, who were on constant guard.

The buildings wrecked by the fury of the hurricane are being torn down, and the almost impassible streets are slowly being cleared of tangled debris. It is estimated that the damage is over \$2,000,000.

Reports of the havoc wrought by the storm are pouring in to the city from all sections, and they are so conflicting that it is difficult to learn exactly what the loss of life is. The dispatches, however, tend to confirm the reports that there was a great loss of life, particularly in the southern keys.

For the Assessor—Charles Short, a Southern Pacific surveyor, is working in the county assessor's office, drawing up plats of the Willamette valley along the S. P. railroad, and a comparison will be made of the aggregate value of the land with lands belonging to people residing adjacent. This work is being carried on by Mr. Short in order to come to a closer estimate of the value of the railroad property in Marion county, for assessment purposes.

Work at State House—The contractors for the work at the state capitol building have begun laying the tile floors. The tiles are composed of little hexagonal pieces glued lightly on paper. The material is shipped in this form, and when the workmen lay it on the cement, they turn the clear face of the tile down, and leave the heavy paper up, and when the tiles are embedded sufficiently in the cement bases the paper covering is removed, and the tile shows up with perfect evenness. The workmen are beginning at the west end of the hall on the second floor. They have laid tile to the center aisle, and are now going around that part of the building. The marble slab borders and baseboards have not been set in place as yet, but this work will take but a short time.
