ONE BURNED TO DEATH AND THREE INJURED

Seattle, Oct. 19 .- Edw. F. Birsch. a recent arrival from southeastern Alaska, was burned to death and three other men seriously injured in a fire which gutted the Denver hotel at Ballard early today. The fire was caused by the explosion of a kerosene lamp in a rear room on the second floor and the entire building, which was of frame construction, was in flames before the score of lodgers could be awakened and notified of their peril.

Mrs. T. S. Lowe, the proprietren of the hotel, rushed through the burning building giving the alarm. Gathering six men in a front room she dropped a rope fire escape to the sidewalk and down this rope the six men slid to safety. Mrs. Lowe | insisted on being the last to leave.

In the meantime the firemen arrived and at the risk of their own lives rushed into the blazing building and carried out the body of Birch and three other men-William Colen. Albert Lanke and Charles W. Johnson-who had been overcome by smoke. They were hurried to the hospital, where it is said all will recover, although they sustained severe burns.

The loss is about \$5,000.


