MEDICINE NOT YET ORDERED

Convicts in the Penitentiary Brought in from Their Outing Await the Prescription.

Just what punishment will be meted out to Convicts Albert Ferris, Mike Nicholich and George Murray, who escaped from the guards at the School for the Feeble Minded on October 15, and, after giving the authorities occasion to burn up more or less gunpowder, surrendered, has not been determined upon yet by the penitentiary authorities.

An investigation is being carried on by Superintendent James, of the local institution, and District Attorney John H. McNary. There appears to be some question hanging over the old law, which provides a capital punishment for a convict who assaults, stabs, cuts, wounds or strikes an officer, guard or person having charge of them, with a deadly weapon. So far as known, there has been no case of this kind in which the full extent of the law was exercised. Inasmuch as the prisoners were employed outside of the prison walls at the time of the escape, the law may or may not apply. The convicts were under the care of guards expressly appointed by the prison authorities for the guarding of the men, and their condition is the same as if they had assaulted a guard within the walls of the institution.

According to the evidence now in possession of the authorities, Nicholich, Murray and Ferris can be held to answer for the crime of assault and robbery and for assault with intent to kill. The first charge would be as applicable to the manner and form in which the convicts overpowered Felix Davis, the guard under whose care they were placed, and, after taking away his gun, escaped. The second, and more serious charge of assault with intent to kill was committed on the person of Walter Johnson, the man shot through the leg in the battle of the 16th, in Beuna Vista.
