PREPARING TO OPEN COLORADO RIVER

Prescott, Ariz., Oct. 22.—Hinging upon the ruling of Secretary of the Interior Ballinger is the future of the town of Parker, Yavapai county, Arizona, a flourishing community of 600 souls. Parker is situated on land, the title to which lies with the department of the interior. This land, it was stated, may be included in a reserve to be used for canal purposes for water supply from the Colorado river to this section. In this event it is possible that the townsite will have to be abandoned.

Secretary Ballinger departed late last night for Albuquerque. His visit here, it is rumored, presages the opening of the Colorado River Indian reservation to settlement.

FIRED FOR FUN, BUT KILLED BOY

Tacoma, Wash., Oct. 22.—Taking a pot shot at a Northern Pacific train "just for fun," as he confessed after his arrest, Terry Wadsworth, a 14-year-old boy of Big Timber, put a bullet through the head of Josiah, the 14-year-old boy of Mr. and Mrs. J. H. Leek, all three of whom were passengers on the train.

Death was instantaneous, and the train bearing the dead body and the parents arrived here today. The Leek family were on their way from Iowa to Tacoma, where they intend to make their home, when the boy was killed. The train was stopped and the Wadsworth boy arrested.

"I was just fooling around," he confessed to the officers, "and shot at the train just for fun."

With two other boys he was impersonating train robbers, and were enacting a hold-up when the shot was fired.
