SILVERTON POSTOFFICE WAR RAGES

Postmaster Blackerby Accused of Having Supported U. S. Senator Jonathan Bourne.

There was a hot bunch of politicians in the city Saturday, chewing over the Silverton postoffice. Postmaster Blackerby was in town, and the opposition, headed by L. J. Adams, was before Congressman Hawley. The charge against Blackerby is not that he has not made Silverton a first-class postmaster, or that he is not a Republican, but that he is a Bourne sympathizer, and that he voted for Senator Chamberlain, which latter charge is probably true, but he was a supporter of the regular nominee, Mr. Calkins, who also committed the crime of standing for election of senators by the direct vote of the people. Adams is the local attorney of several corporations, and was the leader in the fight to break down the primary law in Marion county last year.

A Disgusted Republican.
"One of the delegation that is here," said a man who has always voted the Republican ticket, "is disgusted. What have we to do as a party with the way a man votes on election day. This making war on men for supposed private opinions at the ballot box will never get us anywhere. If we do not trust the people, and are opposed to having them express themselves as to who they want for United States senator, let us come out like men and say so. Ask men like Mr. Adams privately whether they favor election of senators by direct vote of the people, and they will tell you they do not. They want the old way of secret caucus in the legislature, where it is never known what a man gets for his vote. They would be buried out of sight on the platform they stand for, and which they dare not advocate as Republicans."

"I have never voted for Mr. Bourne nor for Mr. Chamberlain, and do not regard that we have been lined up on a postoffice fight over that matter. It involves a principle, for which the Republican party has declared itself again and again—the direct primary and the direct election of senators. On that principle I will not back down, and if the corporation lawyers want to run the Republican party or the politics of the state on those lines they will pay dearly for their experience. It will break up the party and put the corporations back into politics where they belong. It will make men like Bourne and Chamberlain personal and political martyrs to a cause which the people are back of and will perpetuate the interests' hold on state affairs. Let Republicans stand for progressive policies. We are not the party of the rear-guard or the back-track, but the party of the people in Oregon, unless we surrender to dictation of the interests."

JUSTICE PECKHAM IS DEAD

Was Appointed by Cleveland and Was on the State and Federal Benches for 26 Years.

[UNITED PRESS LEARNED WIRE.]
Albany, N. Y., Oct. 25.—Rufus W. Peckham, justice of the United States supreme court, died at his summer home at Altamont at 8:15 last night.

Washington, Oct. 25.—The announcement of the death of Justice Peckham, while expected, came as a shock to his associates on the bench and in official circles. Justice Peckham was a democrat, and before accepting a seat on the bench, gave considerable attention to politics in New York. He was born at Albany, N. Y., November 8, 1838, and had been on the bench, state and federal for 26 years. He came from the court of appeals of his native state.

Guessing His Successor.

Washington, Oct. 25.—That Federal Circuit Judge Horace H. Lurten, of Nashville, Tenn., now presiding in the sixth circuit, including Ohio, Kentucky, Tennessee and Michigan, will be appointed by President Taft to the federal supreme court to succeed the late Justice Peckham, is the belief of many officials here today.

If the place is not offered to Judge Lurten, it is believed that the appointment will be offered to Lloyd W. Bowers, of Chicago, solicitor-general of the department of justice. Possibly the geographical phase will prevent the appointment of either, as both men live outside of the second judicial circuit, over which Justice Peckham presided.

a space of about four hours—its dismantling about the same amount of time. It is in actual use on the stage for a little over one minute, which is an illustration of the vast painstaking exertions put forth by modern amusement enterprises.

The "faceograph" is another popular element in the list of things electrical. By means of a complicated system of lights and mirrors, the features of one of the prettiest of the chorus girls are reflected on a rear "drop" vastly enlarged, and with the tints of her complexion exactly portrayed. On the sheet the girl is seen to smile, pout or roll her eyes, her lips moving with the words of the song "The Girl Up There." The chorus girl in question has to insert her head—upside down—within a small compartment, wherein are powerful reflectors. The electrical power of 150 amps is required for the faceograph, equal to the light force of 300 16-candle power lamps.
