HAD FIVE WIVES : WELCOMED PRISON

[UNITED PRESS LEASED WIRE.] Walla Walla, Wash., Oct. 28.—Found guilty of bigamy, Rev. Frederick Ward, formerly pastor of the Baptist church at Freewater, Ore., probably will be taken to the Washington state penitentiary to begin a five-year sentence today.

Ward made no defense when his case was on trial, and for this reason was given a lighter sentence than otherwise would have been meted out to him.

He admitted that he has wives living Tennessee, Kentucky and North Carolina, in addition to the woman he married in Oregon. Ward is well-known in Eastern Oregon, and, until it was discovered that he was a bigamist, stood high in the various communities. He was a hard religious worker, and conducted a number of revivals.
