Recent automobile accidents have caused a revolution in feeling or the increased impression that the races are no longer sporting events but advertising schemes of automobile manufacturers, this nevertheless is a noticeable decrease of interest today in the Vanderbilt Cup race. Although the day was cloudless and sunny when the race started at 3:30 o'clock this morning there were not

more than 150,000 people present. Before the Vanderbilt race has always attracted a crowd of at least half a million.

The course has been reduced from 23 to 12.65 miles. Fifteen cars started in the race and with the exception of four Italians and one German the drivers were all Americans.

The distance the drivers will cover in the cup race is 278.98 miles, which will require the men to lap the course

22 times.

Among the early arrivals was Sir Thomas Lipton. William K. Vanderbilt took personal charge of the race.
