Fashionable Suitings. For all round wear chevrons and serges in wide or narrow diagonal weaves, with rough or smooth finishes continue popular for suits.

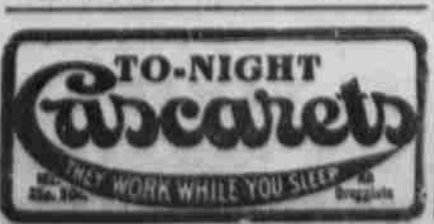
